



Single Outcome Agreement – Safe & Supported

The Community Safety Partnership, a theme group of the Community Planning Partnership, is the strategic group which oversees the delivery of community safety in South Ayrshire.

The Community Safety Service consists of:-

- South Ayrshire Monitoring Service (CCTV, Community Alarms etc.)
- Antisocial Behaviour (Neighbour Disputes) Team (including Mediation, Tackling Violence against Women)
- Two area based Community Safety Problem Solving Teams (including Community Support Officers)

The service works in partnership to encourage:-

- Integration of community safety, antisocial behaviour, community support and violence against women services within the community safety service.
- Integration of partnership services, and
- Integration of Council services

Community Safety Partnership Structure

The strategic purpose of the Community Safety Partnership is to create a safe, healthy and confident South Ayrshire. Three sub groups lead on these key priorities. Each group is led by a different partner. A Problem Solving Coordination Group links with partners – including community groups, identifies and prioritises potential problem-solving groups and identifies available resources.

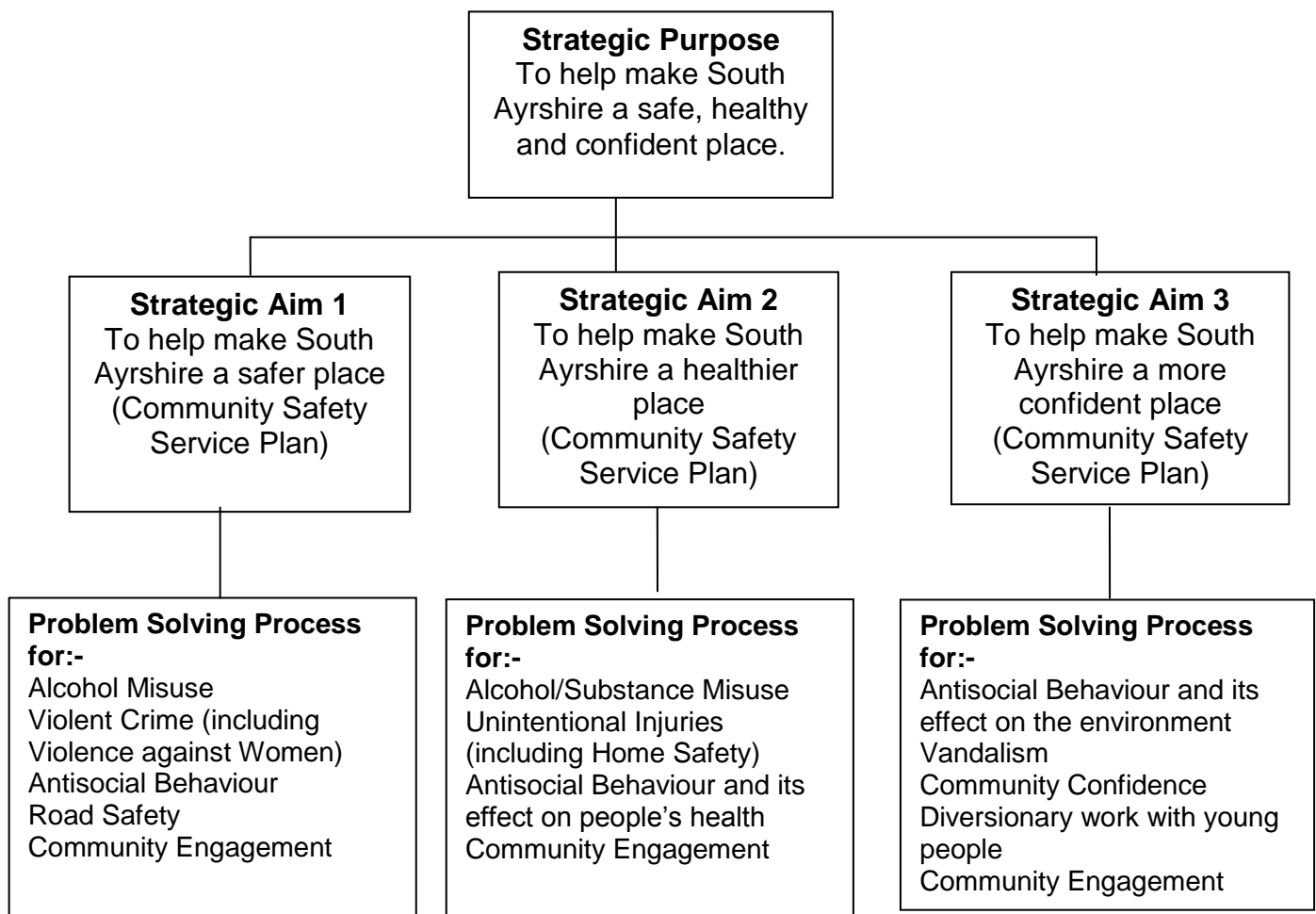


Community Safety Partnership Priorities

Strategic Problem Solving is used by the Community Safety Partnership to identify, prioritise and evaluate the work of the Partnership. This process identifies:-

- The Strategic Purpose – the Partnership’s aims
- The Strategic Aims – the separate problem ‘types’ to be tackled, and
- The Problem Solving Processes – individual initiatives to tackle specific problems.

Using the Problem Solving Approach this becomes:-



“Promoting Positive Outcomes” – Working together to prevent antisocial behaviour

(Antisocial Behaviour Framework March 2009 Scottish Government)

The Community Safety Partnership, in accordance with the Scottish Government’s Antisocial Behaviour Framework “Promoting Positive Outcomes” (March 2009) has a focus on prevention and early intervention when dealing with antisocial behaviour. “Promoting Positive Outcomes” is about promoting positive outcomes through the four pillars of prevention, integration, engagement and communication.

Promoting Positive Behaviours recognises “that most communities are good places to live and work, but that too many, particularly those in our most deprived areas, still suffer as a result of antisocial behaviour (ASB). It believes we will not fix this problem until we realise that it is a symptom of much deeper issues, including drink, drugs and deprivation.

The key message of the Framework is that communities are best served by not having to experience ASB in the first place and prevention, through meaningful community engagement, should be the focus of local approaches.....

The enforcement measures provided by the Antisocial Behaviour etc. (Scotland) Act 2004 will remain available for use, but as part of a much more balanced approach. **The change in emphasis, to place prevention and early and effective intervention at the heart of action to tackle ASB, marks a significant shift in policy.”**

The Antisocial Behaviour Framework includes examples of good practice and details the link between reducing antisocial behaviour and building stronger and safer communities. The four pillars of prevention, integration, engagement and communication form the basis of the strategic aims of the Framework. These in turn are linked to the Scottish Government’s key national outcomes included in the Single Outcome Agreement. Outcome 9 – We live our lives safe from crime, disorder and danger, Outcome 10 – We live in well designed, sustainable places and are able to access the amenities and services we need, and Outcome 11 – We have strong, resilient and supportive communities. The Framework concludes that reductions in antisocial behaviour and increases in community safety will lead to more people living their lives safe from crime, disorder and danger, will lead to less damage and decay to property and will promote more resilient, supportive and responsible communities.

The Safe and Supported section of South Ayrshire’s Single Outcome Agreement links the new Antisocial Behaviour Framework with the Community Safety Partnership’s three year Plan in order to provide a framework for action agreed by all the partners.
