Alloway Bowling Club	To convert part of an existing machine store into a small tea room / viewing area which will be used by members and visitors to watch play on the green. This will encourage older members, some suffering from dementia, to benefit from having a comfortable covered area to watch play.	£1,000.00	Funded
The Ayr Ark	To go towards pilot events for young people hosted at the Ark. Funding would pay for supplies, staff costs and resources as well as professionals when required. To ensure that young people from all backgrounds can attend these free events.	£1,000.00	Funded
Ayr Ex-services Club	To provide interactive music and friendship entertainment for alzheimer's / dementia / multiple sclerosis sufferers, the vast majority of which are older people, together with their family and carers on the first Monday afternoon of every month in the Ayr Ex-Services Club.	£1,000.00	Funded
Ayr Gaiety Partnership	To pay a skilled drama worker to deliver 12 sessions from February to May where they will work with the young people to create a show to perform at the Coylton Gala.	£1,000.00	Funded
Ayr Rugby Club P7 Group	To buy matching strips for team members to give them a sense of pride. All young people in Primary 7, regardless of ability and gender, are encouraged to join the team.	£1,000.00	Funded
Ayrshire Ukes	To purchase a portable PA system which will allow the group to expand their performances to benefit more people and community organisations.	£982.98	Funded
Ayrshire Women's Hub	To help fund a five day film-making workshop for young people who are all Barnardos service users from the Ayr South area. The workshops will cover the community refurbishment of 42 Alloway Street, where older people, local people struggling with isolation and/or depression will be taking part in a series of upcycling, painting and DIY workshops.	£1,000.00	Funded
Belmont Academy	To purchase equipment that will allow the transition club, which is made up of pupils from the six cluster primary schools, to introduce different sports which will link with inclusion, which will enable pupils from Southcraig ASN School to attend the club.	£1,000.00	Funded
Bujinkai Karate Club	To help fund a group of very talented Karate Club students to attend the World Championships in Dundee. This is a once in a lifetime opportunity for some of these students.	£1,000.00	Funded
Community Gift Exchange	The group will take part in Zero Waste Scotland's Instrument Amnesty this March and support a small team of job seekers gain work experience through operating a collection, sorting and distribution hub in an empty retail unit at the Kyle Centre.	£1,000.00	Funded
Coylton Baby & Toddler Group	To provide damp-proof storage for baby toys, by obtaining and erecting a new waterproof shed, and obtaining new damp-proof storage trunks. This will replace the current shed and storage boxes which are old and deteriorating and pose a risk to health and hygiene for the babies and toddlers.	£871.88	Funded

Coylton Community Gala	To organise a family fun day to include the whole community by providing soft play areas for under 3's and fun participatory games and activities for age 5 and over. Funding will also help with the cost of family rides and games and a pipe band.	£1,000.00	Funded
Coylton FC	To purchase matching kits, goals and training equipment to enable the club to host the 9v9 game and have their own identity. This will help the young people feel part of a proper team when playing in the league and the local tournaments.	£1,000.00	Funded
Coylton Sheltered Housing Unit	To fund computer classes for residents of the SHU and also for the wider community. The group are taught skills such as surfing the internet. e.g. online shopping, local activities, games and also ordering prescriptions or arranging GP appointments.	£960.00	Funded
Forehill Primary School Parent Council /Fundraising Group	To provide a series of playground markings, games and set up of a Trim Trail assault course to support and develop the children's outdoor education and physical development in a safe environment, which supports social interaction.	£1,000.00	Funded
Forehill, Holmston & Masonhill Community Council	To install a defibrillator machine in the area that covers residents living in Masonhill, parts of Holmston and Hillfoot Housing Estates. The equipment will be placed on an external wall and will be available for use 24 hours a day.	£1,000.00	Funded
Independence from Drugs and Alcohol Scotland (IFDAS)	The group are setting up a residential training and social enterprise development centre at the former SRUC Walled Garden site at Auchincruive for people in recovery from alcohol or drug misuse. Kincaidston & Belmont Bowling Club	To help towards the cost of repairing the badly damaged bowling green due to vandalism. The members are mainly elderly people who enjoy keeping active by playing bowls and enjoy having the opportunity to socialise.	£500.00	Funded
PSP Association Carers' Support	To pay for twelve monthly meetings in the carers' café in Ayr Hospice to provide support and information, understanding, moral and emotional support to individuals who are suffering from Progressive Supranuclear Palsy and Corticobasal Degeneration.	£580.00	Funded
