The group hosted an information session on 16TH November 6.30pm-7.30pm in Kirkoswald Church Hall. The purpose of the session was to encourage those interested to find out a bit more about the community listening service. The session was well attended by a range of individuals who were interested in this work. The group will now work with Judith Hugget to organise interviews and training sessions February 2017.
