<p>Update</p>	<p>Margaret provided an update from the recent Strategic Planning Advisory Group (SPAG) meeting. Key points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Locality Review Recommendations were all agreed (including name change to Locality Planning Partnerships and re-launch in Spring) and will now go to the next Integration Joint Board meeting for sign off • SPAG membership was discussed • Didn't go through the Locality Planning updates at the meeting (only 2 LPG Reps present) • It was highlighted that LPG's are planning groups and not action groups - they have a 'development' role? <p>Jacqui asked Lesley if there was anything to update from public health. Lesley - still waiting to see how it's going to look - the new Communities and Population Health Strategic Delivery Partnership will bring things together.</p>	
<p>Progress Updates</p>	<p><u>Communication & Engagement</u></p> <p>Jacqui provided an update from the first Communication & engagement sub group meeting (Jacqui, Hugh, Seonaid). Key points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discussed how to increase public awareness and understanding of locality planning and how to let members of the public know they can participate and engage • Discussed the best people to try and engage with to find out what the community needs/is looking for - e.g. people/services delivering redirection options • Gaps in resources/demand - cross over funding, e.g. Vic's & Vine Community Fund • Also talked about Supermarkets - some projects might not fit with their funding streams so perhaps they could re-direct to us 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • action to contact local Supermarket Community Champions

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mary’s idea around the family case study example - lived experience • Suggested an additional ‘Prestwick Connect’ at the 65 Club, although we have the BHH at Biggart it would be beneficial to have a more visible option on the Main Street to complement this and try and engage more locally and in different ways • Jacqui asked the Elected Members about questions or themes that come up at their Surgeries - nothing specific although waiting times do come up <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Elaine highlighted not getting equipment and waiting times for physio - clinical governance meeting - complaints and concerns ○ Ian highlighted that complaints about social care element do arise, e.g. care packages, waiting times and Social Work assessment - strain on resources • Eligibility criteria changing from substantial to critical only - how do we reach/support those in substantial category? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Seonaid highlighted that the South Ayrshire Connect hub’s will support this <p>Jacqui mentioned that she had attended the first Caring for Ayrshire Insights and engagement group - similar messages/challenges</p> <p><u>Funding sub group</u> (Liz, Elaine, Seonaid)</p> <p>Following on from the discussion at the last meeting the sub group met on the 11th November. Key points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Agreed to target a small proportion of the funding to Monkton & Symington and stick with the combined event on 7th March at Prestwick Academy. • Decided to hold an open funding discussion to find out which groups might be interested and what would be of most benefit to the wider community - utilised the Symington Community Council meeting for this, which took place on 19th November - it was noted that due to such short notice no one came along to the meeting to specifically discuss funding but due to Christmas break and short timescale to administer the funding before end of March it was a useful meeting. • Plan for a ‘conversation cafe’ again to consult on local priorities and promote 	<p>Seonaid - contact Ruby to discuss and identify timings</p>
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	<p>relaunch - learn from previous...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plan a social event for previously funded groups - what's worked well, what are the gaps, how are groups/projects doing, sustainability, future ideas - need to learn from and utilise previous projects/contacts - strengthen engagement with third sector and neighbourhoods <p>Hugh highlighted that through discussions he's had it was highlighted that could we do something locally to raise awareness of mental health and suicide, linked to local football teams, e.g. awareness event. Could Locality Planning champion this? It would require a small bit of funding but could have a great impact. General discussion ensued:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • good idea to raise awareness and understanding • very emotive subject • emotional wellbeing sits within our local priorities • Not sure about football focus • A lot of compassion - if it fits with priorities <p><u>Actions</u></p> <p>As previously discussed it was agreed to allocate funding to the Walking Football pilot in Monkton via Monkton Community Council and the Connect Accessible Book Group for people with sensory impairment via RNIB Connect (this has developed from the Troon pilot which was funded through PB earlier in the year). Proposal outlines for both projects have been submitted, with condition of grant to include links and updates to locality planning.</p> <p>Explore options to ensure small proportion of funding is targeted to Symington and Monkton (small amount already allocated to Monkton for walking football). This could be through PB process, small community marketplace/engagement event or e.g. targeted at Village Community Hall to benefit whole community. Amounts need to be established and timescale.</p>	<p>Seonaid to action and keep group updated</p> <p>Sub Group/Jacqui</p>
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
