Minutes of a hybrid webcast meeting held on 24 April 2025 at 10.00 a.m.

Opening Remarks

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting, outlined the procedures for conducting this meeting and advised that it would be broadcast live.

1. Declarations of Interest

Councillor Brennan-Whitefield declared an interest in items 7c & 7d.

2. Date of Next Board Meeting

The Chair advised that the next Board meeting would be held on Thursday 22 May 2025 at 10.00 a.m.

3. Minutes of Previous Meeting

The **Minutes** of the Meeting of South Ayrshire Licensing Board of 13 March 2025 (<u>issued</u>) were submitted.

Decided: to approve the Minutes of the previous meeting.

4. Update by Licensing Standards Officer (LSO)

The Licensing Standards Officer advised –

- (1) that since the last Board meeting, Ayr Racecourse had successfully hosted the Scottish Grand National festival. This event benefitted from the permissions granted under the premises licences for the Racecourse and the Western House Hotel and additionally from Occasional Licences to cover the additional alcohol sales areas both permanent and temporary.
- (2) that there was a considerable amount of pre-event planning and consultation which involved a number of agencies and departments for large events. Part of this was the liquor licence, which came under the responsibility of Ross Donald. Over the past few years Ross and his team had made changes to practices and procedures at the bars to improve customer experience but

also to satisfy compliance with the licensing objectives and to consider comments and requests from the LSO. The positive results of these improvements was evident at the Grand National meeting on Saturday 12th April due to the very effective and efficient running of the large bar in the tented village. The well organised queuing system was efficiently stewarded by SIA badged staff who ensured that there was a continual flow of people to the bar area which was well staffed and laid out in such a way that meant orders and payments could easily be taken by staff at the front (who had time to assess patrons and record ID checks) whilst additional staff poured and delivered drinks to the bar. In general, challenges associated with agency staff continued to be addressed on the day, she commended Ross Donald and his team for their speed and willingness to act when any potential issues were highlighted to them.

- (3) that the next month would be busy in terms of liquor licensed events in South Ayrshire with the Pavilion Music Festival in Ayr and the Folk Festival in Girvan to name a few. Not only would these events benefit from an Occasional Licence for the main event but there were also applications from local licence holders to extend their operating hours to take advantage of the extra demand in the area.
- (4) that there were currently applications pending for the transfer of premises licences in South Ayrshire following the sale or lease of buildings, some of which have remained closed for some time. This was very positive and will bring further investment and in turn choice for customers.

The Board

Decided: to note the update from the LSO.

Subject: Revocation of Personal Licences

1. Purpose

To advise members on the revocations of personal licences.

2. Recommendation

To note the terms of the report

3. Background

The Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 introduced personal licences. It is a condition of the personal licence that (a) the applicant undertakes refresher training within five years of the date of issue of the licence and (b) no later than 3 months after the expiry of five years from the date of issue produces evidence of the training to the Board. Failure to complete either part of the process means that the Board must revoke the personal licence. (Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 section 87(3)

4. Current Position

Since the last report to the Board, a further 11 personal licences have been revoked under delegated powers. All licence holders affected have been advised by post to their last known address of the revocation of their licences. Revoked licence holders can still take refresher training and then reapply for another personal licence although there is a cost of £50 for the new application. (There is no fee payable if the refresher training is completed and intimated to the Board on time.)

1. Background:

The Board must, in considering and determining the application consider whether any of the grounds for refusal applies and-

- (A) if none of them applies, the Board must grant the application, or
- (B) if any of them applies, the Board must refuse the application.

The grounds for refusal are—

- (a) that the subject premises are excluded premises. Excluded premises are defined as premises used as a garage or which form part of premises which are so used. Premises are used as a garage if they are used for one or more of the following-
- (b) the sale by retail of petrol or derv
- (c) the sale of motor vehicles, or
- (d) the maintenance of motor vehicles

However, premises used for the sale by retail of petrol or derv, or which form part of premises so used, are not excluded premises if persons resident in the locality in which the premises are situated are, or are likely to become , reliant to a significant extent on the premises as the principal source of –

(i)petrol or derv, or

(ii)groceries (where the premises are, or are to be, used also for the sale by retail of groceries).

- (C) that the application must be refused under section 25(2), 64(2) or 65(3),
- (D) that the Licensing Board considers that the granting of the application would be inconsistent with one or more of the licensing objectives,
- (E) that, having regard to—
- (i) the nature of the activities proposed to be carried on in the subject premises,
- (ii) the location, character and condition of the premises, and
- (iii) the persons likely to frequent the premises,

the Board considers that the premises are unsuitable for use for the sale of alcohol,

- (e) that, having regard to the number and capacity of-
- (i) licensed premises, or
- (ii) licensed premises of the same or similar description as the subject premises,

in the locality in which the subject premises are situated, the Board considers that, if the application were to be granted, there would, as a result, be overprovision of licensed premises, or licensed premises of that description, in the locality.




