Chairpersons report

We have had a change in our membership due to the retirement of Ann McGinnis and Jane Jardine, as yet, their spaces have not been filled despite advertising for more members.

Carrick Futures funds were distributed, along with funds from Assel Valley and Kilgallioch, with several local groups benefitting from this, as shown in the accounts.

There have been many topics under discussion throughout the year and we have finally seen some investment in the town with improvements to the shorefront, the 3G pitch and the beginnings of the new play park on Victory Park with more investment planned for the town.

The sale of the Bandstand to ACE has been completed and it will be a boost for the town as well as a great addition to the shorefront to have this iconic building brought back into use.

It was very interesting to have had the opportunity to attend a visit to Dunbar, organised by SURF, to see how they are moving forward with their regeneration as they are a similar seaside town to ours.

The new Girvan's Story group will be chaired by the Community Council and over the next year there will be a series of events to see what people think of SAC plans for the town. As Cllr Clark stated, "We need to make sure that proposals reflect the opinions of residents and businesses to maximise the benefits."

Treasurers report

Ken mentioned that funds were originally to be distributed to the four schools but it was discovered that no single group could receive more than £50. As Girvan Academy had already received £25 earlier in the year they were provided with another £25 while the other schools would receive £30 each. There is currently a total of £6,000 in the Carrick Future fund and a total of £6,847.86 in the community council bank account. No other issues.

Ken stated that Rhona would need to sign off on the accounts before they are submitted to South Ayrshire Council.

David G noted that the allocation of funds over £50 is not specified in the new 'blue book'.

Ken inquired about the possibility of giving the auditor a £30 gift voucher for her services. Community councillors agreed to this.
