Opening Remarks

In the absence of the Chair, the Depute Clerk welcomed everyone to the meeting, outlined the procedures for conducting this meeting and advised that it would be broadcast live.

Appointment of Chair

The Depute Clerk to the Board sought nominations for the appointment of Chair. Councillor Kilbride seconded by Councillor Townson moved that Councillor Brennan-Whitefield chair this meeting of the Licensing Board. As this was an unopposed motion Councillor Brennan-Whitefield took the chair.

1. Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest by Members of the Board in terms of the Councillors' Code of Conduct.

2. Date of Next Board Meeting

The Chair advised that the next Board meeting would be held on Thursday 12 February 2026 at 10.00 a.m.

3. Minutes of Previous Meeting

The **Minutes** of the Meeting of South Ayrshire Licensing Board of 9 December 2025 ([issued](#)) were submitted.

Due to the lack of members in attendance who had been present at the meeting of 9 December 2025, consideration of these minutes was continued to the next Board meeting,

The Board

Decided: to continue consideration of the Minutes of 9 December 2025 until the next Board meeting of 12 February 2026.

4. Update by Licensing Standards Officer (LSO)

The Licensing Standards Officer advised

- (1) that feedback following the festive season suggested that whilst hospitality venues were well supported at Christmas and New Year, the increased running cost of premises meant that profits were less than had been in previous years; and
- (2) that the rise in minimum wage and national insurance contributions for staff had a significant impact on all licensed premises large and small and as a result they are operating with less staff resulting in a lot of premises having shifts with only one staff member on duty. This is also significant in terms of the Boards policy statement and the expectation that a personal licence holder should always be on duty and this may mean that premises will require all staff to hold a personal licence (or at least have completed the SCPLH training) to ensure that all staff are trained to the same level and equipped with the knowledge they require regarding complying with the legislation; and
- (3) that whilst January is traditionally a quiet month for the licensed trade, the LSO is extremely busy with visits requested by licence holders and premises managers looking for information and guidance on future projects, events and increased facilities. This is extremely positive in terms of strong working relationships with the trade but also an indication of continued investment and new ideas for South Ayrshire this year; and
- (4) that there will be several significant events for the hospitality trade in 2026 but the most eagerly anticipated is the football world cup. The Scottish Government are very clear that the decisions regarding Licensing in each Local Authority area will lie firmly with the relevant Licensing Board. Each Board will take decisions regarding what is most appropriate for premises in their area and in anticipation of a future debate by the Board the LSO had met with a few licence holders to discuss their views about extended hours. Additionally, the South Ayrshire Local Licensing Forum will meet at the end of this month to hold a full discussion with the intention of providing feedback to the Board for their February meeting.

- (2) that Board members would also be aware that there was an active Local Licensing Forum in South Ayrshire and monthly attendance from Forum Members at the Board meetings; and that the Forum met last month and nominated Janice Lindsay as the new Chairperson;
- (3) that the South Ayrshire Forum took an active interest in the work of the Board and had recently written to the Board regarding their future consideration of Extended Hours for significant events;
- (4) that Licensing Forums existed all over Scotland, however not all were able to meet as regularly as prescribed in the legislation and nor did other Boards have as regular attendance from Forum members and she acknowledged the commitment shown by the South Ayrshire Forum;
- (5) that only applications that were unable to be granted under delegated powers were brought before the Board for a decision of grant; that there had been 104 Occasional Licence application so far this year and 9 applications for Extended Hours, with each of these individually processed and a response from the LSO and Police Scotland must be received for each one before they could be granted; and

Subject: Revocation of Personal Licences

1. Purpose

To advise members on the revocations of personal licences.

3. Background

The Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 introduced personal licences. It is a condition of the personal licence that (a) the applicant undertakes refresher training within five years of the date of issue of the licence and (b) no later than 3 months after the expiry of five years from the date of issue produces evidence of the training to the Board. Failure to complete either part of the process means that the Board must revoke the personal licence. (Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 section 87(3))

4. Current Position

Since the last report to the Board, a further 4 personal licences have been revoked under delegated powers. All licence holders affected have been advised by post to their last known address of the revocation of their licences. Revoked licence holders can still take refresher training and then reapply for another personal licence although there is a cost of £50 for the new application. (There is no fee payable if the refresher training is completed and intimated to the Board on time.)

1. Background:

An application for a provisional premises licence for a single storey premises operating as a café and arts space with outside drinking area

The core hours sought are 10.00- 00:00 daily for on sales and 10.00 – 22.00 daily for off sales.

The applicant states on the operating plan that the premises may also be open from 8am for the purposes of providing a meeting space, breakfast and general use by local artists. The premises may also hold life drawing and general cultural performance/programming.

The applicant states the capacity of the venue is 90 persons.

The Board must, in considering and determining the application consider whether any of the grounds for refusal applies and-

(A) if none of them applies, the Board must grant the application, or

(B) if any of them applies, the Board must refuse the application.

The grounds for refusal are—

(a) that the subject premises are excluded premises. Excluded premises are defined as premises used as a garage or which form part of premises which are so used. Premises are used as a garage if they are used for one or more of the following-

(b) the sale by retail of petrol or derv

(c) the sale of motor vehicles, or

(d) the maintenance of motor vehicles

However, premises used for the sale by retail of petrol or derv, or which form part of premises so used, are not excluded premises if persons resident in the locality in which the premises are situated are, or are likely to become, reliant to a significant extent on the premises as the principal source of –

(i) petrol or derv, or

(ii) groceries (where the premises are, or are to be, used also for the sale by retail of groceries).

(C) that the application must be refused under section 25(2), 64(2) or 65(3),

(D) that the Licensing Board considers that the granting of the application would be inconsistent with one or more of the licensing objectives,

(E) that, having regard to—

(i) the nature of the activities proposed to be carried on in the subject premises,

(ii) the location, character and condition of the premises, and

(iii) the persons likely to frequent the premises,

the Board considers that the premises are unsuitable for use for the sale of alcohol,

(e) that, having regard to the number and capacity of—

(i) licensed premises, or

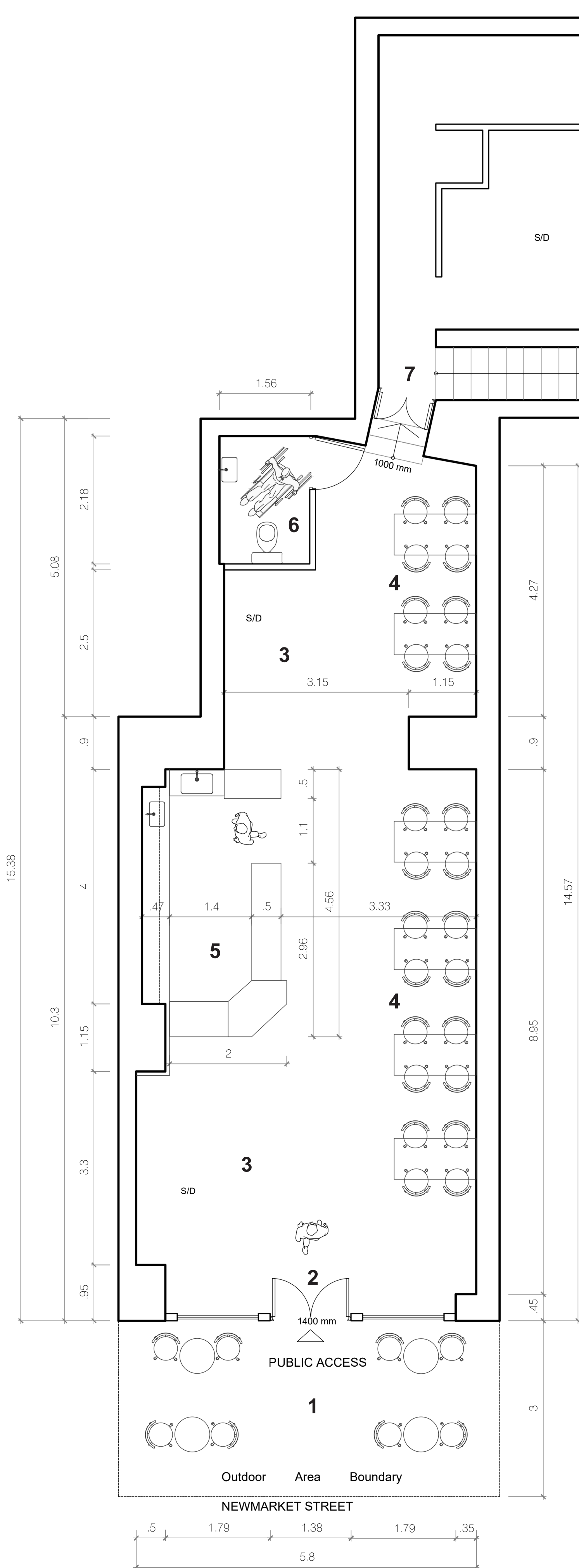

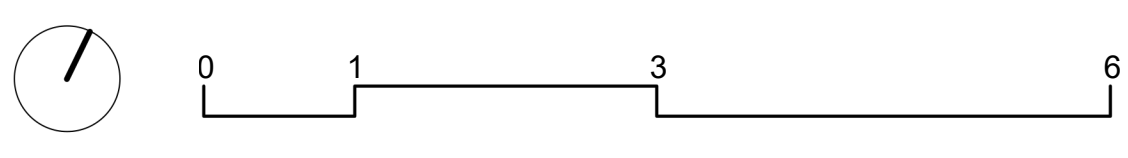

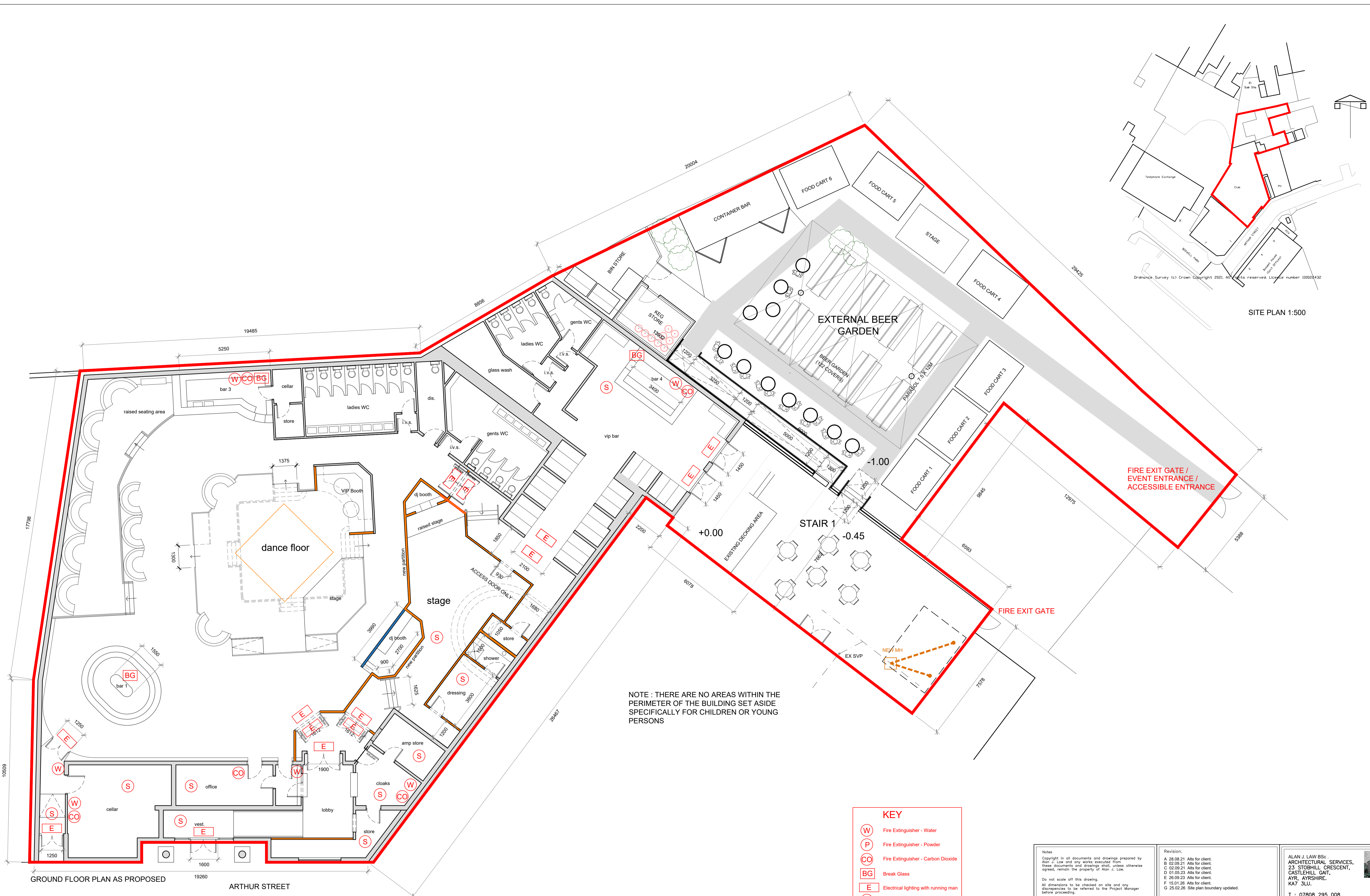
Location plan

Currently the operator is considering the ticket charge and planning to donate a portion of this to a local charity.

The applicant is therefore in agreement with the following condition being added to the grant of Extended Hours:

- Tickets must be sold in advance and the number of tickets sold is to be shared with the LSO and Police Scotland when requested prior to the event
- No under 18's permitted on the premises

The maximum capacity of these premises (over two floors) is 645, however the operator has advised it is likely that the event will be restricted to one area dependant on ticket sales.

Considering the above I am satisfied that this application demonstrates the measures that are expected by the Board for this event of national significance and support the grant of extended hours as requested.

This will ensure consistency with those premises who already have permission to open beyond 1am and will include CCTV, an SIA Door Steward, a personal licence holder on the premises, a first aider on the premises, a system of regular toilet checks and written policies in relation to the safe evacuation of patrons and the prevention of drug misuse.
