**Opening Remarks**

In the absence of the Chair, the Depute Clerk welcomed everyone to the meeting, outlined the procedures for conducting this meeting and advised that it would be broadcast live.

**Appointment of Chair**

The Depute Clerk to the Board sought nominations for the appointment of Chair. Councillor Kilbride seconded by Councillor Townson moved that Councillor Brennan-Whitefield chair this meeting of the Licensing Board. As this was an unopposed motion Councillor Brennan-Whitefield took the chair.

**1. Declarations of Interest**

There were no declarations of interest by Members of the Board in terms of the Councillors' Code of Conduct.

**2. Date of Next Board Meeting**

The Chair advised that the next Board meeting would be held on Thursday 12 February 2026 at 10.00 a.m.

**3. Minutes of Previous Meeting**

The **Minutes** of the Meeting of South Ayrshire Licensing Board of 9 December 2025 ([issued](#)) were submitted.

Due to the lack of members in attendance who had been present at the meeting of 9 December 2025, consideration of these minutes was continued to the next Board meeting,

The Board

**Decided:** to continue consideration of the Minutes of 9 December 2025 until the next Board meeting of 12 February 2026.

#### 4. Update by Licensing Standards Officer (LSO)

The Licensing Standards Officer advised

- (1) that feedback following the festive season suggested that whilst hospitality venues were well supported at Christmas and New Year, the increased running cost of premises meant that profits were less than had been in previous years; and
- (2) that the rise in minimum wage and national insurance contributions for staff had a significant impact on all licensed premises large and small and as a result they are operating with less staff resulting in a lot of premises having shifts with only one staff member on duty. This is also significant in terms of the Boards policy statement and the expectation that a personal licence holder should always be on duty and this may mean that premises will require all staff to hold a personal licence (or at least have completed the SCPLH training) to ensure that all staff are trained to the same level and equipped with the knowledge they require regarding complying with the legislation; and
- (3) that whilst January is traditionally a quiet month for the licensed trade, the LSO is extremely busy with visits requested by licence holders and premises managers looking for information and guidance on future projects, events and increased facilities. This is extremely positive in terms of strong working relationships with the trade but also an indication of continued investment and new ideas for South Ayrshire this year; and
- (4) that there will be several significant events for the hospitality trade in 2026 but the most eagerly anticipated is the football world cup. The Scottish Government are very clear that the decisions regarding Licensing in each Local Authority area will lie firmly with the relevant Licensing Board. Each Board will take decisions regarding what is most appropriate for premises in their area and in anticipation of a future debate by the Board the LSO had met with a few licence holders to discuss their views about extended hours. Additionally, the South Ayrshire Local Licensing Forum will meet at the end of this month to hold a full discussion with the intention of providing feedback to the Board for their February meeting.

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**Subject: Revocation of Personal Licences**

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**1. Purpose**

To advise members on the revocations of personal licences.

**2. Recommendation**

**3. Background**

The Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 introduced personal licences. It is a condition of the personal licence that (a) the applicant undertakes refresher training within five years of the date of issue of the licence and (b) no later than 3 months after the expiry of five years from the date of issue produces evidence of the training to the Board. Failure to complete either part of the process means that the Board must revoke the personal licence. (Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 section 87(3))

**4. Current Position**

Since the last report to the Board, a further 10 personal licences have been revoked under delegated powers. All licence holders affected have been advised by post to their last known address of the revocation of their licences. Revoked licence holders can still take refresher training and then reapply for another personal licence although there is a cost of £50 for the new application. (There is no fee payable if the refresher training is completed and intimated to the Board on time.)

**APPLICATION REPORT**

**1. Background:**

An application for a provisional premises licence for an end terrace premises operating as a pub, restaurant and hotel.

The core hours sought are 10.00- 00:00 daily for on sales and 10.00 – 22.00 daily for off sales.

The applicant states on the operating plan that the premises may also be open from 8am for tea/coffee and breakfasts to the community. As the premises has accommodation, residents may watch televised sport or play background music out with core hours.

The applicant states the capacity of the venue is 64 persons.

**2 Reports**

There have been no objections or representations.

Section 50 Certificate from Planning has been lodged along with the application.

### 3. Board Options

**(c) the sale of motor vehicles, or**

**(d) the maintenance of motor vehicles**

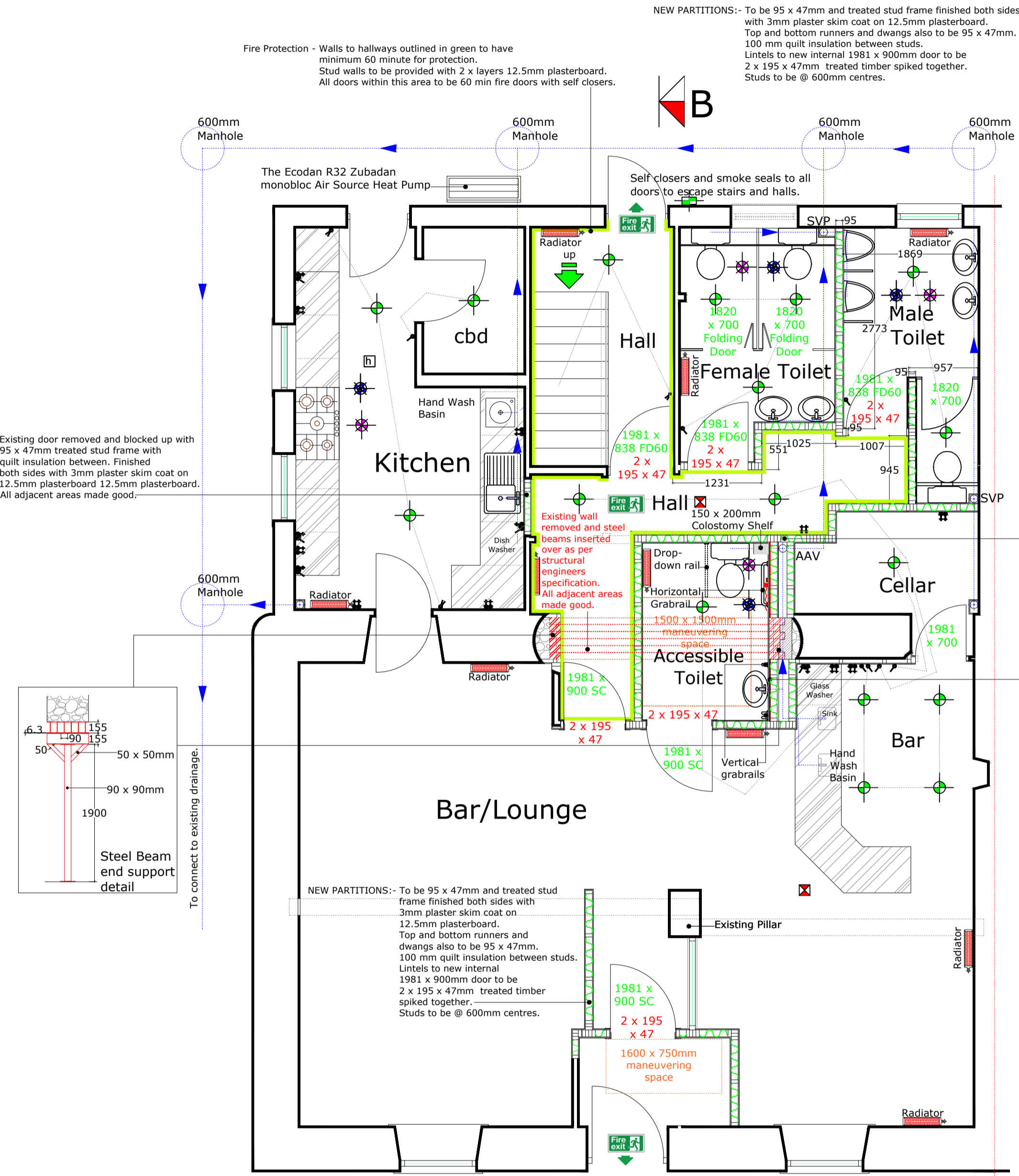

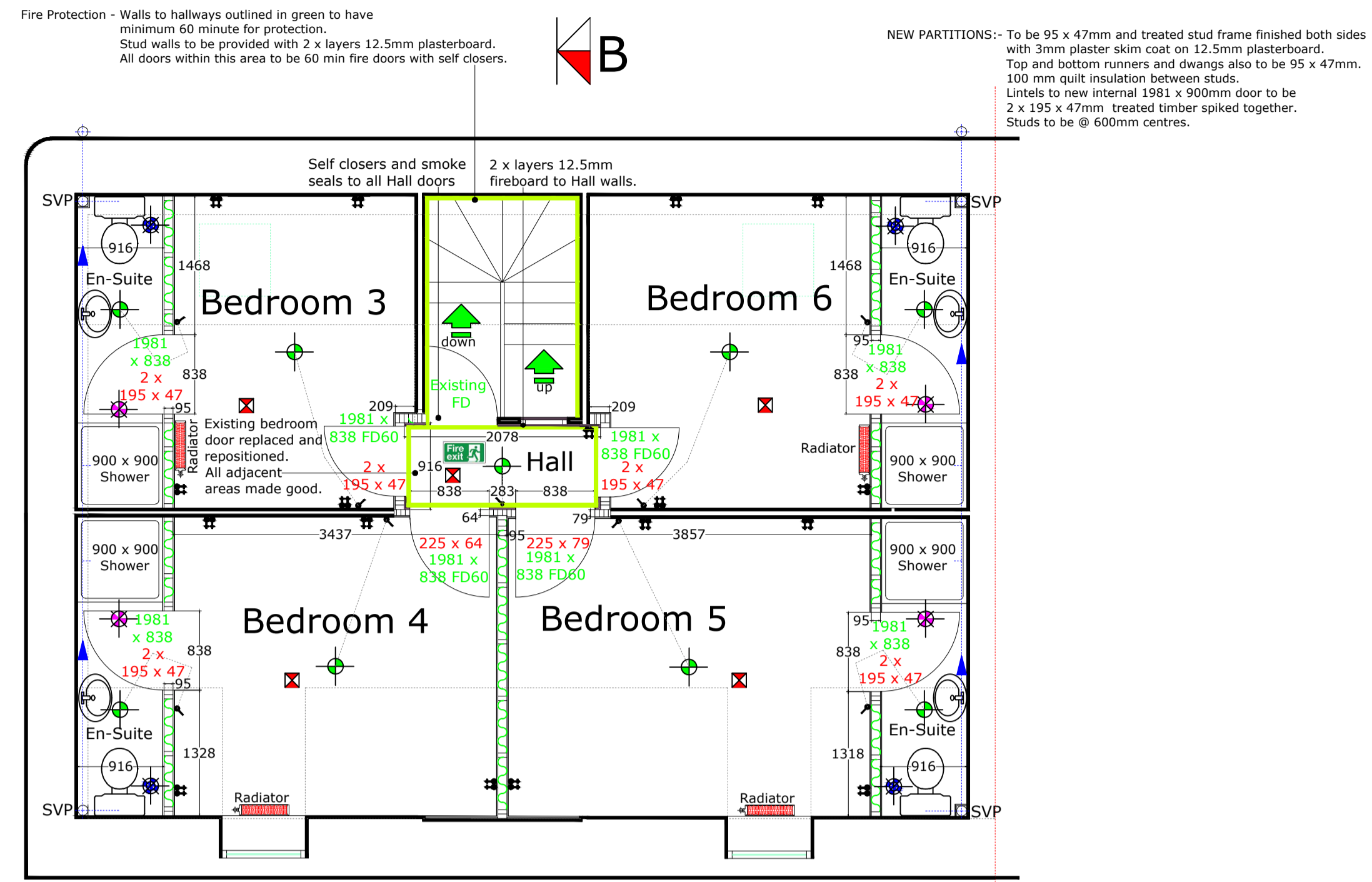

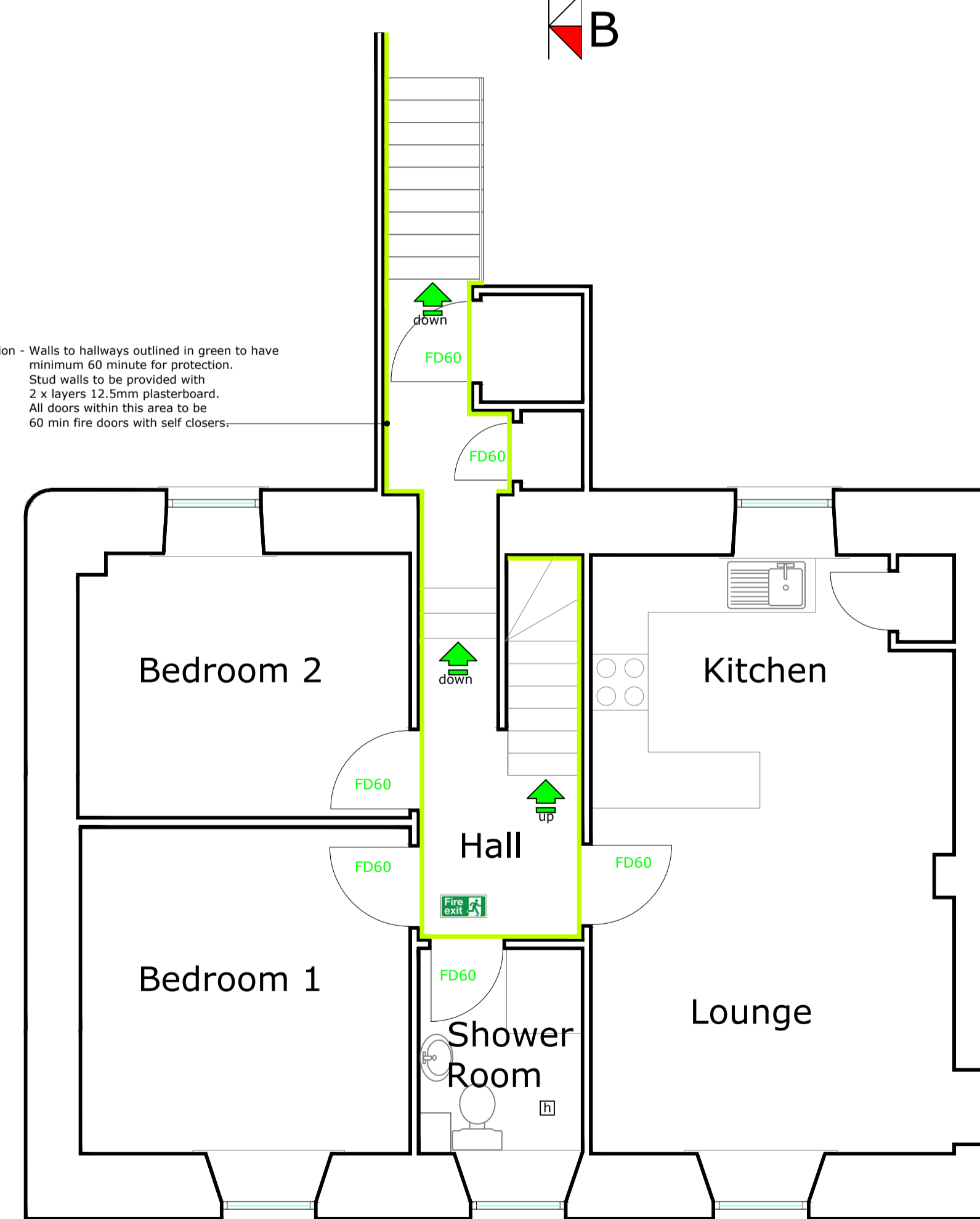

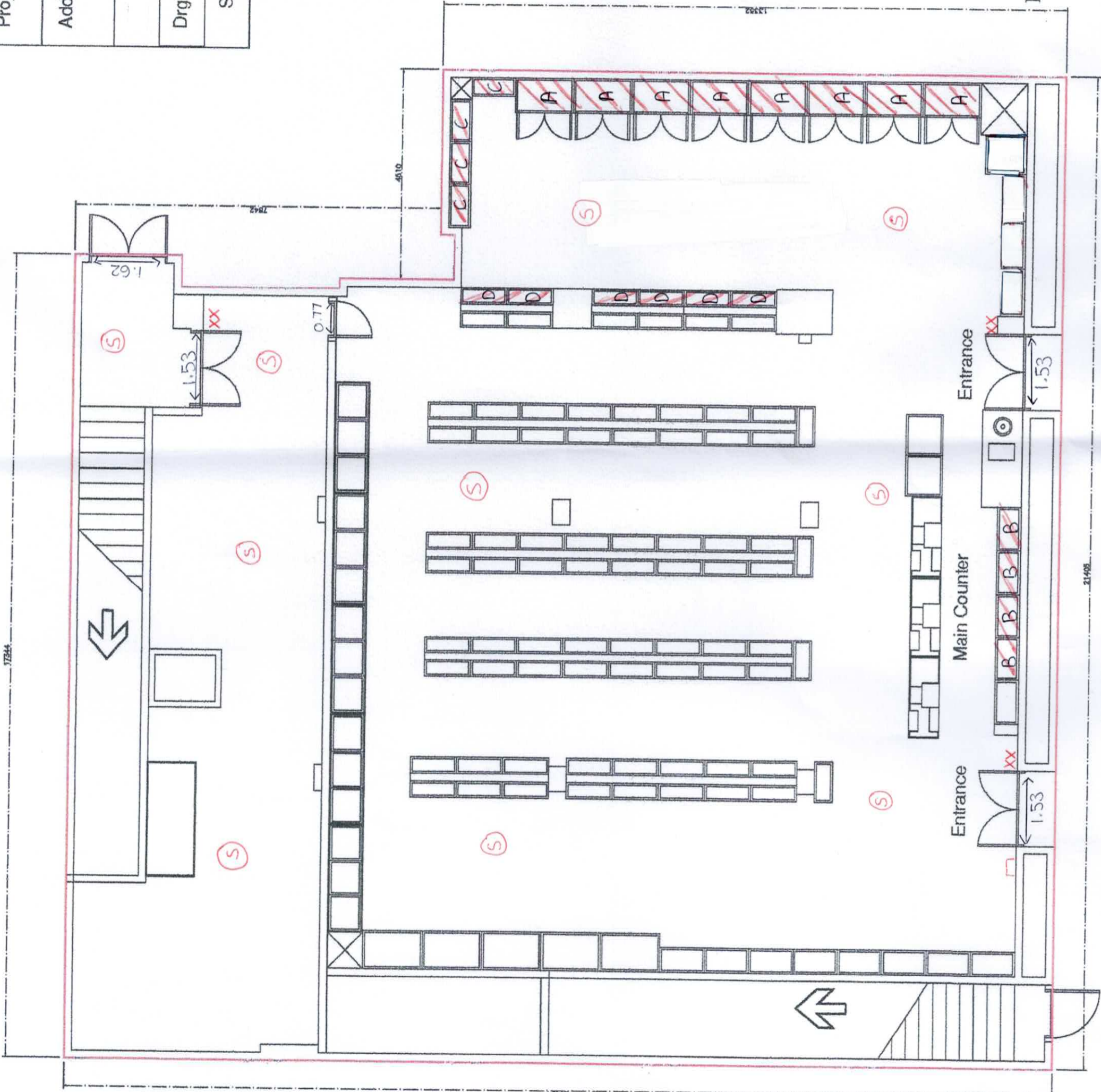

Report by Licensing Standards Officer

I refer to the Occasional Licence application made by John Reid, who is a personal licence holder, for the event now being described as a ‘two day music festival with DJ’s and live acts’ on the Low Green in Ayr on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> and Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2026.

The application requests a licence from 12noon until 10.45pm both days and as this is an outdoor event it therefore not able to be granted under delegated powers under the Boards current policy.

In addition to this, the Occasional licence request includes the consumption of alcohol throughout the identified site, which again is an irregular occurrence in South Ayrshire, however it has been granted by the Board to this annual event since it started in 2023.

Members will be aware that the music event, known generally as the ‘Pavilion Festival’ has grown and developed each year, meaning the current application suggests an attendance of over eleven thousand people over the two days and this is reflected in the separate public entertainment application.

As per last year’s event the proposal is to have the main bar and VIP bar and this year there will also be a ‘Bucky Hub’ which is a branded area offering merchandise and a drinks menu featuring the Buckfast Tonic Wine brand who are partners of this years festival. I understand that there will be branding and a Buckfast theme throughout the festival tying in with the relationship to Scotland with one of the taglines ‘No Buckie, No Party’.

Having spoken to the applicant for the Occasional Licence and having information provided by the organiser, I can confirm that there will be no bottles of alcohol provided and all alcohol will be sold in measures. Board members will also be pleased to know that there will be a number of re-useable sponsored cups provided.

Over the past few years the Board have been willing to deviate from policy in relation to the terminal hour of 10pm, being satisfied that the later time of 10.45pm would allow time to disperse the crowd and prevent a breach of the byelaw if the event were to run later due to weather or delays and this has reflected the same timings on the public entertainment licence. In the past two years the applicant undertook to close the bar prior to the licensed hours and use the remaining time to encourage customers to ‘drink up’ and therefore dispose of their empty alcohol receptacles when leaving the event, rather than buy a late drink and consume it quickly or attempt to take it with them. I would encourage this practice by the applicant again this year.

As the grant of the liquor licence over the past few years has been out with the Boards usual policy (and this event has been the only one since that has benefitted from this) it has been monitored both by Police Scotland and the LSO and I can confirm that the occasional licence has not been the subject of any complaints. I have included some photographs taken by me at the 2025 event to show members the large festival tent that was introduced last year and examples of the queuing system in place.

In the interests of consistency in South Ayrshire in relation to other Occasional Licences granted previously and in the future, and to reflect the practice implemented by the Board at other large capacity outdoor venues, I would ask the Board to consider the following, which they may wish to include as conditions on the Occasional Licence:

- All alcohol is to be decanted and not served in glassware or bottles, however cans are permitted
- A refusals record should be kept at the bar areas and token sales booth/s as proof of diligence
- Training records should be available for all bar staff and each staff member should wear a badge to identify themselves to the police or LSO
- Drinking water should be available free of charge at identifiable areas

I would remind the Board and indeed the public that the grant of this Occasional Licence will only permit the consumption/possession of alcohol in the specified area of the Low Green in Ayr in relation to this event and the timings given and it will not be permitted for alcohol to be taken out with this area or out with these times. Therefore, grant of this licence will not allow persons not in attendance at this event to be in possession of alcohol on the Low Green.

Report by Licensing Standards Officer

I refer to the Occasional Licence application made for a private music function in the famous Pavilion Ballroom within the recently refurbished Pavilion Building in Ayr.

The application is for a private function that will be for a maximum of 500 attendees. The event is to be ticket only and will not be advertised, but instead customers who are on the mailing list will be invited to purchase a ticket.

As the application requests a terminal hour of 2.00am it is out with what can currently be granted under delegated powers as the Board generally grant a 12midnight terminal hour.

The event itself will take place within the Pavilion Ballroom which members will be aware has recently undergone a renovation and is part of the iconic Pavilion building that is currently navigating the application process to obtain a full premises licence with the intention of becoming a licensed events venue. In the meantime, as per the Board's policy, the premises have benefitted from Occasional Licences to allow them to trade and to generate an income to fund the ongoing refurbishment and secure the future sustainability of the premises as an events venue.

The terminal hour of 2am is sought for this event to allow for the 'Pavilion Bank Holiday Bash' which will feature local DJ's, possibly a local band and food and refreshments for an audience who may be in the area for the weekend to enjoy various activities on offer nearby. The music event will run from 8pm until 2pm and like other venues in the local area who have been granted extended hours for this date, the operator hopes to take advantage of increased footfall in the area and interest from music fans.

Having spoken to the applicant in detail about his proposal and indeed working with him on an ongoing basis in relation to his application for a premises licence, I am satisfied that this is a unique event and I understand the importance of later hours to ensure its success

In relation to the licensing objectives I am assured that there will be door stewards in attendance and all staff are trained in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005. Additionally the whole building is covered by an approved CCTV system. Therefore, I would suggest that if the Board were minded to grant the application they may wish to add the following conditions to remain consistent with other applications that have recently been granted:

- Event for those aged 18 years and above
- Tap water will be available free of charge on request
- SIA Door Stewards
- First Aider on the Premises
- Personal Licence Holder on the premises
- Policy in place to prevent drug misuse
