## Wallacetown Operational Delivery Plan

This plan has been developed to ensure appropriate governance and leadership is in place through the SDP and Operational Groups, to enable improved access to services and ensure better outcomes for people living in Wallacetown. The information below provides further detailed information on the SDP/Operational Group structure and purpose of the operational delivery groups – it has been agreed to include a fourth subgroup for the 'Shaping Places for Wellbeing Programme'.

- A number of general and maintenance repairs undertaken including wall and rendering repairs, uplifting leaves and rubbish at several locations, graffiti removal, gutter cleaning and replacement.

# Wallacetown Improvement Strategy 2022 -2024

The plan sets out how partners, including community members, will work together to adopt a public health approach to tackling inequalities and deprivation in Wallacetown. This preventative approach seeks to improve the health and safety of everyone by addressing underlying risk factors.
