SUBJECT: ANNUAL INSPECTION AND REVISED SAFETY CERTIFICATES FOR SOMERSET PARK, AYR

1. Purpose

1.1 To advise the Panel of the outcome of the annual technical inspection of Somerset Park, Ayr, and to seek approval for the issue of revised Safety Certificates for the ground.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 It is recommended that the Panel:
 - 2.1.1 agrees that the current Safety Certificate remains in force until 30th June 2022, provided that no adverse reports are received at the meeting; and
 - 2.1.2 agrees that the revised Safety Certificate will come into force on 1st July 2022, for the period of one year.

3. Background

- 3.1 Under the Safety of Sports Ground Act 1975 Somerset Park is designated as a ground requiring a General Safety Certificate. In addition to the Safety of Sports Grounds Act 1975 the ground is covered by the Fire Safety and Safety of Places of Sport Act 1987, and related Safety of Sports Grounds Regulations. Main guidance is given by the "Guide to Safety at Sports Grounds", (the "Green Guide"). Although the guide has no statutory force, many of its recommendations are made statutory by their inclusion in the General Safety Certificate.
- 3.2 Somerset Park currently has a General Safety Certificate issued by South Ayrshire Council to Ayr United Football Club (AUFC). Under the terms of the Certificate AUFC are defined as "Holders" of the Certificate. The Certificate sets the ground capacity of Somerset Park at 10,185.

3.3 A Revised Safety Certificate for Somerset Park was issued in June 2019 and was agreed to be extended due to the Covid 19 pandemic in June 2020 and again in June 2021. The current Certificate is valid until 30th June 2022, unless withdrawn by the Council. The Safety Certificate states that all assessment, surveys and reports required should be completed by 28th February each year, with any remedial works carried out to the satisfaction of the Council by **14**th **July**, prior to the beginning of the new football season.

4. Proposals

Technical Reports

4.1 Building Standards Services, South Ayrshire Council

4.1.1 A visit was made to Somerset Park on 28th April 2022. It can be reported that all the required assessments, surveys, certification and reports are now in place. The annual Structural Assessment Report has been received by the Council along with required Structural Safety Certificate. Within the Report there is a number of maintenance works required and as such a schedule of works has been prepared and issued to AUFC for completion prior to 14th July 2022.

A further inspection will be scheduled by Building Standards to confirm that all necessary works are completed by the 14th July.

- 4.1.2 It can be reported that as part of the long-term Maintenance Agreement for the stadium, that the trackside wall was replaced in full prior to the pandemic. It should be noted however that the sterile area at the back of the wall remains in place, and that there is no increase in the overall capacity of the ground. It has been requested that this sterile area adjacent to the new wall is clearly delineated with markings to stop spectators standing in this area and to prevent any surcharge pressure on the wall.
- 4.1.3 As part of general upgrading of the overall stadium two replacement external stairs to the main stand were installed in October 2017. The installation of these new stairs required the benefit of a Building Warrant which was not sought at that time of the installation. The new stairs erected did not comply with required current regulations and AUFC were informed that they would require to apply for a Late Building Warrant. This was duly submitted, and they were also further advised that the stairs could only be used in emergency evacuation of the stand

It should be noted at the time of writing this Report a Completion Certificate has not been accepted and that the stairs are still not fully compliant. AUFC have been informed that if this remedial work is not competed to the satisfaction of Building Standards prior to the new season, then this could result in a reduction of the capacity of main stand or possible closure.
