the region over summer
delivering workshops and
joining in community events.

One of the Biosphere's ongoing initiatives is the Biosphere Communities scheme which brought in Ballantrae at the beginning of 2022 with Colmonell and Barrhill to follow later in the year. The scheme is a way of celebrating village life and the cultural identity of our communities. It is also the beginning of a longstanding connection that includes direct support from the Biosphere for initiatives that are led by local people

and development groups.
An example is the Ballantrae
Festival of Food & Drink
which took place in June; the
Biosphere helped to promote
the event as a showcase
of small businesses across
the region and as a way
for people to learn more
about what is being grown
and produced here in South
Ayrshire.

The Biosphere team delivers projects that support conservation, education, and sustainable business, and which share our history and heritage. As an organisation the Biosphere aims to be as inclusive and accessible as possible, and for those who cannot always attend events in person they have a dynamic new website which launched in June.

This includes a News section, plus a directory of outdoor activities, attractions, and 'Biosphere Experiences' available in South Ayrshire and beyond. For those who prefer social media the Biosphere is also active on Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter.

Whether you're exploring South Ayrshire physically or digitally, look out for the Biosphere's Proud Supporter logo. This is a free scheme that signals support for our environment and communities and is open to anyone to join, whether individuals, businesses or groups.

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SOUTH AYRSHIRE SUCCESS communities to participate in **AT TENANT AWARDS**

South Ayrshire has been recognised at the recent Tenant Participatory Advice Service (TPAS), National Good to work with tenants and Practice Awards.

Tenant Participation in South Aurshire was nominated across four categories and achieved awards in three of these.

Winner - The Alan Ferguson Award for Tenant/Resident Champion (Frances Carson)

This award recognised an outstanding and inspirational tenant who has made a significant contribution over the last 12 months towards meeting the needs of fellow tenants and others in their community along with supporting other tenants and

decisions to improve housing services and their landlord's performance. Frances demonstrated this through her passion and commitment communities to embed a culture of participation to work towards positive outcomes.

Runner-up - Best Practice In **Involving All (South Ayrshire Council, Tenant Participation** Team)

Our TP Team were recognised for the fantastic work they have done in reaching out to people in our communities who have faced challenges accessing services and continuing to provide support and information in innovative ways. They have kept tenant participation involved and connected

through these challenging and uncertain times. Their dedication to adapting engagement to ensure no one has been left behind or unable to participate has been recognised at a National Level.

Runner-up - TP Champion Group (Muirhead Tenants and Residents Association)

This award highlighted a voluntary group who has made an outstanding and inspirational contribution throughout lockdown demonstrating how they have maximised services, delivered outstanding support, listened to and addressed local people's needs. Muirhead Tenants and Residents Tenant Association led the way in showing members of the community that by coming together

they would collectively get through the pandemic. They have demonstrated that a community is stronger when it works together and the community spirit has thrived. Muirhead Tenants and Residents Tenant Association committed to supporting their community during the Covid-19 pandemic however this has continued beyond

the pandemic and grown to become standard practice within the community.

Councillor Martin Kilbride, Buildings, Housing and Environment Portfolio Holder for South Ayrshire Council said: "Congratulations to Frances Carson for winning her award, it highlights all the selfless work she undertakes

Tenancy Details



Did you know that if you're tenancy details are not up to date this may cause issues with your tenancy rights? If your household details are incorrect this can affect you and members of your household, should you wish to sub-let your tenancy, assign your tenancy, or add a joint tenant to your tenancy agreement.

To ensure that your tenancy rights are protected it is very important to ensure that you

advise us of any changes to your household. This includes telling us about anyone who has previously moved in with you who you haven't already told us about, and when anyone moves into or out of your home in the future at the time they do so.

If you need more information or would like to check/change your household details, please contact your local housing office.

Protecting Our Employees

We request that tenants do not smoke within their property when an employee of the Council is visiting.

This includes when repairs or general maintenance is being carried out or when a contractor is carrying out work on the Council's behalf.

It is good practice not to smoke in the property for at least 30 minutes before an employee visits your property. Please help us to protect our employees from second-hand smoke.

This includes vape or vaping.

Employees and contractors have the right to refuse to carry out the work within the property if the tenant refuses to stop smoking.

Hello, my name is Angi Pinkerton, and I am the Trauma Informed Practice Officer for South Ayrshire Council. I am a proud Mum to 2 boys and 1 dog furbaby, who take up most of my free time.

Since graduating, as a mature, first-generation student, I have worked within various areas of social care and community development.

Due to my own lived experience of trauma, I am

passionate about improving outcomes for those living with the impacts of trauma and adversity.

In line with national commitments, South Ayrshire Council aims to become a trauma informed and responsive organisation by promoting the 5 principles of trauma informed practice: safety, choice, collaboration, trust, and empowerment across all our services. As we believe creating trauma responsive systems improves outcomes and reduces adversity and inequalities.

Trauma informed practice is a strengths-based approach that focuses on building relationships and connections with people. Our aim is to reduce experiences that have the potential to re-traumatise individuals and I plan to support people to realise the prevalence of trauma, recognise its impact and respond appropriately.

As trauma is everyone's business, I am currently developing a South Ayrshire Trauma Champions network, for people with lived experience of trauma, to help co-design and co-produce trauma informed and responsive services.

We need access to keep your home safe!

GAS SAFETY...

The Council as a landlord has a legal requirement to ensure that all gas appliances and flues in your home are checked and certified as being "safe" every year.

To meet this legal requirement the Council must access all its homes with gas appliances to carry out a service and safety check every year. At the same time the Engineer also checks that your smoke detectors are working. When the annual gas safety check in your property is due, our contractor, PH Jones, will write to you to offer an appointment for the work to be carried out. If the date or time does not suit. then please call the number on the letter to arrange a convenient date and time that does.

When our contractor PH Jones visits your property for its Annual Gas Safety Check they will:

- Service and clean your gas boiler and gas fire
- Check all smoke detectors are working properly



In March 2022, new legislation was introduced by the Scottish Government to ensure that Social Landlords carry out an Electrical Installation Condition Report (EICR) in Council homes at least every five years. This electrical safety check allows the electrician to inspect all electrical installations and fittings within your home to ensure they are safe and remain in good working order. It is important that these tests are carried out to identify any issues and have these resolved.

During the visit, the electrician will also inspect the fire detection equipment within your home to ensure these are in working order and meet the current legislative requirements.

We will notify you when your next electrical safety check is due to be carried out at your property. You will be provided with further details regarding the electrician's visit, and details of how to contact to arrange an appointment.

Most tenants provide access to have these important safety checks carried out.

However, a small number of people do not allow access to their property. In line with legislation, the Council is entitled to force entry in such circumstances and this is also a provision of the Council's tenancy agreement. The Council will have no choice but to force entry and change the locks to the properties of tenants who have refused to allow entry. Please remember that these essential checks are carried out to ensure the safety of you and those around you!

If the Council are required to force entry to your home, you will be charged for the costs of this action and also renewing the locks, this will be a minimum of £61.97.

Please avoid this
unnecessary expense
by allowing entry to the
Operatives when they are
scheduled to attend. It is
easy, and can be arranged at
a time that suits you.







TPAS Scotland is working with the Tenant Participation **Regional Networks and the Scottish Government to** carry out a survey on rent affordability with tenants across Scotland.

Over the past year the Regional Networks supported by TPAS Scotland and the Scottish Government, have been researching affordability in the social rented sector. This has involved speaking

to landlords, on how they set rents, learning about affordability tools and how they work, and discussing how different landlords throughout Scotland consult on rent increases.

The next stage of this research is to send out a survey both to landlords and tenants through-out Scotland to tell us how they set their rents to ensure their rents are affordable.


The survey is due to go live on the 31st August 2022, keep an eye out for it.

From this we hope that tenants and landlords will

come forward to take part in our focus group discussions so a report can then be published later in the year.

This research has taken a lot of time and commitment and is crucial in determining what affordable rents look like to tenants and landlords now and in the future.

At Social Security Scotland, we want to ensure that everyone gets the payments they are entitled to. We do that by offering a variety of ways people can apply for benefits including online, by phone or face-to-face and have colleagues available to help in all local authority areas across Scotland.

We currently deliver twelve benefits for people on low incomes, carers, families and disabled people. Our newest benefit is Adult Disability Payment - which has been introduced as a pilot in Perthshire and Kinross, City of Dundee, Western Isles, Angus, North Lanarkshire, South Lanarkshire, Fife, City of Aberdeen, Aberdeenshire, Moray, North Ayrshire, East Ayrshire and South Ayrshire. The payment will rollout nationwide from 29 August 2022. Adult Disability Payment replaces Personal Independence Payment in Scotland, previously delivered by the Department for Work and Pensions.

We also support families on low incomes with a series of family payments. Scottish Child Payment provides

financial support to families with children under six. The payment is £20 per week per child and will be extended by the end of 2022 to all eligible children under the age of 16 and then will also increase to £25 per child per week.
