Social and Community Capital – Coronavirus Response Fund	Up to £50,000	Open – deadline 29/6/2020	<p>One-off grants are available to not-for-profit organisations across the UK who employ people from disadvantaged or vulnerable groups and who have suffered a loss because of the coronavirus/COVID-19 lockdown restrictions.</p> <p>In response to the coronavirus/COVID-19 pandemic, S&CC has launched the £1 million Coronavirus Response Fund, which is for organisations across the UK that employ people from vulnerable or disadvantaged groups.</p> <p>The funding aims to bridge the income gap so that organisations survive the crisis and continue to have a positive impact in their communities.</p> <p>Applications will be open from midday on Monday 22 June and stay open for at least one week, until midday on Monday 29 June 2020. Applications may be open longer depending on how many applications are received. Coronavirus (COVID-19): Aquaculture Hardship Fund	Up to £40,500	Open – deadline 30/6/2020	<p>Funded by the Scottish Government, this programme is administered by Marine Scotland. The programme has a total value of up to £3 million to be provided through grants. The maximum level of grant for a new applicant may vary depending on the business and the application, with the absolute maximum available being £40,500. The grant will be paid as a lump sum by electronic bank transfer.</p> <p>For new applicants, grant payments will cover three months and be equivalent to 50% of the average monthly gross revenue from sales of aquaculture products over three months in 2019 of each full-time business. For businesses not meeting the full-time in</p>
