3. Minutes of Previous Meeting  
Minutes of 07 September 2022 were proposed by FdF seconded by RT.

4. Police Report  
Police were unable to attend, however sent their report. There were 16 incidents raised in the month of September with 3 crime reports being created from these incidents with 2 being detected at this time:

5. Matters Arising  
*SAC/Ranger Service / UnderSky – September Walking Festival*  
The Walking Festival itself was cancelled along with all SAC events due to the death of the Queen. However, the UnderSky event took place and was very well attended by children and adults.

*G&SA Biosphere*

On-going - Biosphere Community, revisit later this year – leave on agenda.

### *Platinum Jubilee*

PW has sent the final accounting to FdF, indicating that there was a carry forward of approx. £1,100 for the next event.

### *LACER Funding Application*

Secretary advised we were successful and would receive a grant for £6,000. PW had already been galvanising support and volunteers with help of Pauline Eaglesham (Comm Hall Ass). PW and PE would form a small group, RT indicated he would join, together with A another from CHA. Feedback has indicated that a food bank/pantry, and clothes/small electrical swap would be well received. It was made clear that this should not affect the two shops in the village. Cllr PH advised that VASA had expertise, and the Girvan and Maybole Pantries would be good contacts for help.

### 6. Wind Farms – General

Per headings below (have taken away ones that have not been updated recently):

**Clauchrie to Knockodhar overhead lines** – SPR - waiting ECU advice.

**Clauchrie** – Consents Unit - ECU00002001 (ref 074). SAC formally objected. Public Enquiry – DPEA – WIN-370-3 – is now with the Reporter – a lot of controversy.

**Important – DPEA advised that Craiginmoddie, Carrick and Knockcronal are all before the Scottish Ministers and the suggestion is there will be a Conjoining of Inquiries – due to their proximity to each other. ET advised that there might be a possibility for objectors to get together, as happened for the Linfairn Inquiry.**

**Craiginmoddie** – reduced to 14T up to max 200m – basically ex-Hadyard Hill Extension – Energie Kontor. Full consultation ECU00002196 – response submitted to ECU. Additional Information consultation response submitted 13 Jan 2022. SAC had objected at their Regulatory meeting on 03 Feb. ***Now under Appeal with DPEA – WIN-370-4 – DCC have indicated that we will be involved with the oral process. Other members of the community have also received documentation and will also participate. Some have not received the oral process info – DPEA/ECU checking.***

**Carrick Forest** – reduced to 13T up to 200m inc Energy Storage System – ECU00002063 – scoping response sent. *Full consult, ECU00003392 – response submitted on 28 May 2022. SPR have asked to attend our 02 Nov meeting.*

**Knockcronal** – Scoping – ECU00002181 – response lodged - ex-Linfairn, now 9T up to 200m, and 3T up to 180m. Public Events at Dailly and Straiton. Stratkraft/ECU – extension until 14 Feb. Objection submitted 13 Feb.

**Kirk Hill** – planning extension granted to 2022 – height now 115.5m. Ripple Energy attended July meeting. ***Nothing new happening – Ripple will keep in touch.***

**Tralorg** – operational since 21 Oct 2020. Funds received. ***Expecting further fund money. The Trust have decided to increase the retained amount for operating the fund.***

**Knockodhar** – 32T tip height up to 200m inc Energy Storage System. South side of Stinchar Valley. In Scoping ECU00002153 – sent response 27 Nov 2020. ***Though we have not been advised it is understood that the number of turbines has been reduced from 31 to 16. Even though Pinmore & Pinwherry had not been consulted, they were able to send in an objection.***

**Scienteuch** – *in SAC Planning 22/00654/DEEM – RES Natural Power* – ECU00003318 – 9T, up to 200m – basically Lamdoughty and Keirs Hill, NE of Straiton, S of Patna.

Cllr PH advised that **Chirmorie** was again being consulted – SAC 22/00660/FURM – pending consideration – 22T upto 146.5m height.

**If members of the community have any comments regarding proposed windfarms, they should make their views, whether positive or negative, known to the CC as soon as possible, or direct them straight to the planning application.**

7. Paths / Dailly Trails / Dalquharran

PW advised that there were areas of the new path that needed drainage – puddling – especially near the Community Gardens – Secretary to advise Rachel Shipley/SAC.

A member advised the Kilgrammie Trail had its paths widened – assumption by the forestry company for forestry machinery. LM indicated that Linsayston Trail was still overgrown. There had been several complaints again about the path near Craig Farm – a lot of gorse. FdF suggested that people walk with their pruners and clear as they go.

Secretary had sent out some funding info for Ian Findlay Path Fund for comment re the potential replacement of the Waulkmill Bridge. After discussion it was agreed that we did not quite fit the criteria re Active Travel. Secretary to advise IFPF, and check other funders – possibly ARIA in the Spring.

8. Roads / Potholes / Gully Pots

ARA were attending the overgrown verges and hedges on the U25 (Dailly-Barr) with the farmer. Other reported issues were in process. The painted stones had been removed. The sweeper attended the village. Secretary will check again re the flashing sign at Eldinton/Woodside – possibly delayed parts. BS advised that there were sunken drains at Hadyard Terrace – Secretary to check.

Cllr PH advised that there might be diverted traffic in the area due to resurfacing through the village of Barrhill.

9. Hadyard Hill Community Fund Dailly - Panel and Small Grant Fund

NB advised that a Panel meeting was held on 13 Sep. A £10,000 grant for running costs had been agreed for Carrick Activity Centre. CAC were asked to consider applying for 3-years funding to provide continuity. The SSE fund would be increasing by 10% (RPI) to approx. £65,000 – less 12% for FS admin fees. The endowment fund had unfortunately reduced due to the present crisis.

Clare Graham/FS was in the process of finalising the framework for the Education and Training Fund, which should be going live shortly. Under delegated powers CG should be able to respond to applications within 4 weeks.

Small Grant Fund – one application from the Parent Partnership for partial costs for the

children to travel by bus to the Gaiety for the Pantomine - requesting £650 – unanimously agreed that this was a good use.

Secretary had spoken to CG/FS re the £200 for the Land Registry – she indicated that the CAP grant should be closed. Secretary completed a SGF application based on last month's recommendation/approval and handed it to FdF.

Will endeavour to proceed with the SSE/MW issue in the coming months.

Tralorg £19,300 received on 25 May 2022, Kirk Hill Community Benefit Funding still to be discussed/agreed with Ripple.

As previously advised PW had applied in June to SAC for funding for the Christmas Lights. PW had only recently been advised that there was no funding available. As time was short for applying to HHCFD, Secretary suggested that some of the Tralorg fund could be used – no actual application was necessary, only the agreement of the CC. After discussion it was agreed that £3000 could be used, obviously there needs to be proper accounting/evaluation. PW was in the process of becoming a bank signatory for the Christmas Lights; there might be some funds available in the account that could be used. PW to liaise with FdF/CC.

#### 10. Development Trust/SCIO

PW advised that there was little to report, applications to OSCR were now taking about 100 days to approve a SCIO. Timing possibly mid-Dec, or early next year. There were 12 out of 13 trustees, with 2 affiliated groups – Dailly Amateurs and CHA.

#### 11. Community Hall Association

NB advised that last week they had the AGM – Pamie Wells (Chair), Paul Pain (Treasurer), they were looking for a Secretary. A suggestion was to have a youth experience worker, through the Skills & Employment team. Bingo and Psychic Night were arranged for the coming months.

The CHA was registered as part of the Cosy Spaces, and the Drop-in Room was now open – Wed 2-4pm, Thu 5.30-6.30pm. There is some additional furniture. The Room must be supervised by volunteers, and a list is being developed. VASA/SAC can advise re refreshments and other practical things.

The contact booklet created by VASA will be distributed by hand through the fire bridge, police, ambulance shortly.

#### 12. Carrick Activity Centre

HM indicated that there was nothing really to report. The AGM will be Tue 25 Oct.

#### 13. Councillor's Report

Cllr PH advised that 09 Oct was an important date as there would be a decision re bus subsidies, which could cut services. There were no drivers and none being trained. If members could complete the SPT Strategy Consultation which could help identify possible routes.

Sacred Heart School was open, and Girvan Primary was going ahead. The 3G pitch work would start soon, and be finished by Spring. The Methodist Church in Dalrymple Street is up for sale. Several Churches were amalgamating. Over 60% of the Church of Scotland Estate was being sold off.

A member asked about SAC employees going back to the office. Cllr PH advised that various Centres were open, and people were going back into work, however there is hybrid working. People are slowly getting back to the office. Efficiency Surveys have been carried out – people want more for less money.

#### 14. Treasurer's Report

FdF advised following balances - DCD a/c: £1,173, DCC a/c: £39,539.

#### 15. Any Other Business

*Website* – Secretary advised that the Dailly Website was being updated. Groups and organisations were being asked to update their info and give to Secretary to pass on. CC advised that the update should be mobile friendly and to make full use of algorithms – linking Facebook and Website.

*Wreaths* – RT would again make arrangements for the Wreaths.

*Christmas Events* – to be advised to Facebook and Secretary for the Website.

*Energy Agency* – there was a suggestion to ask the EA to come to a public meeting re energy efficiency. Suggested time before the School pick-up in the afternoon, say 2pm.
