Report by Head of Legal and Regulatory Services to Regulatory Panel (Licensing) of 1st December 2022

Subject: Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 – Late Hours Catering Licence Exemption Applications

1. Purpose

1.1 The purpose of this report is to present 3 applications requesting an exemption from the requirement to obtain a late hours catering licence for a particular occasion which requires to be determined by the Panel.

2. Recommendation

- 2.1 It is recommended that the Panel:
- 2.1.1 accepts the 3 letters received from Gosschalks Solicitors, attached as Appendix 2, on behalf of their client Wm Morrison Supermarkets Ltd and all dated 27 October 2022, as applications for exemptions from the requirement to hold a late hours catering licence, in terms of Section 42(5) of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982;
- 2.1.2 determines whether to grant the applications to Wm Morrison Supermarkets Ltd for exemption from the requirement to hold a late hours catering licence for Morrisons Petrol Filling Station, Duke Street, Troon; Morrisons Petrol Filling Station, Castlehill Road, Ayr; and Morrisons Supermarket, Castlehill Road, Ayr; between 23:00h and 00:00h from Thursday 23 December 2022 to Friday 24 December 2022 inclusive; and
- 2.1.3 if the Panel agrees to grant the 3 applications, it imposes the South Ayrshire Council late hours catering conditions, under deletion of the word "licence holder" and insertion of the word "applicant" applicable to late hours catering licence attached at Appendix 3.

3. Background

3.1 A Late Hours Catering Licence is required for the use of premises between the hours of 23:00h and 05:00h for the sale to, or consumption by, the public of food in accordance with section 42(1) of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 ("1982 Act").

3.2 The Council has received 3 applications under section 42(5)(a) of the 1982 Act for an exemption from the requirement to hold a late hours catering licence for a particular occasion, namely Christmas, at the 3 locations referred to in paragraph 2.1.2 between 23:00h and 00:00h from Thursday 23 December 2022 to Friday 24 December 2022 inclusive. The relevant premises are located at the Morrisons Petrol Filling Station, Duke Street, Troon, Morrisons Supermarket, Castlehill Road, Ayr and Morrisons Petrol Filling Station, Castlehill Road, Ayr. A copy of the letters which were submitted as applications for exemption are attached at **Appendix 2.**

4. Proposals

- 4.1 An exemption from the requirement to hold a late hours catering licence is permitted under section 42(5) of the 1982 Act in respect of any particular occasion or during a specified period not exceeding 2 months in any period for 12 months, upon application to the local authority. South Ayrshire Council has no prescribed application form or fee which requires to be completed or paid for this kind of application. The applicant has applied in writing through their solicitor and has requested that the letters be treated as their application for exemption.
- 4.2 In terms of the South Ayrshire Council Scheme of Delegation there is no delegated authority for the Head of Legal and Regulatory Services to grant this kind of exemption. Accordingly, this application requires to be determined by the Regulatory Panel.
- 4.3 I f the Regulatory Panel are minded to grant the exemption applications, they are able to impose conditions on the applicant in terms of section 42(6) of the 1982 Act which would apply throughout the exemption period specified. The Regulatory Panel has previously approved standard conditions which are routinely applied to late hours catering licences and it is recommended that the said conditions may be appropriate to apply in these circumstances. The conditions would apply throughout the exemption period. A copy of the said conditions is attached to the report at **Appendix 3.**

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Standard Conditions for a Late Hours Catering Licence

- 1. The licence holder shall be permitted to trade in or from the above premises and no other premises.
- 2. The licence holder is permitted to sell meals or refreshment for consumption on as well as off the licensed premises hereby licensed during the following hours:-
 - Monday Tuesday Wednesday Thursday Friday Saturday Sunday
- 3. The licence holder shall at all times ensure that the premises comply with all regulations applicable to the premises made under The Food Safety Act, 1990, and any other amendments in respect thereof and Orders arising therefrom.
- 4. Where there is a material change of circumstances affecting the licence holder, or the activity to which the licence relates, the licence holder must notify South Ayrshire Council of the change as soon as reasonably practicable after it has taken place.
- 5. The Licenceholder shall deliver this licence document to South Ayrshire Council where the licence relates to an activity either which he/she has given up or has had suspended/revoked and that within seven days of the said surrender/suspension/ revocation.
- 6. The Licenceholder will provide an appropriate litter receptacle for use by patrons at a suitable location outside the licence premises; will empty the receptacle when necessary and will ensure that the area in the immediate vicinity of the receptacle is kept in a clean and tidy condition, all to reasonable satisfaction of the licence Authority.

7. As an alternative to the requirements the Licenceholder may make other arrangements for the clearance outside the licence premises of litter generated by carry-out sales subject to the prior approval of the arrangements by the authority

- 8. The Licenceholder is advised that the premises may be covered by the Fire (Scotland) Act 2005, which require that the employer or other relevant person undertake a fire risk assessment. Further guidance is available in the document "Fire Safety Guidance Booklet" which is published by the Scottish Executive. (www. Infoscotland.com/firelaw).
- 9. The Licenceholder shall ensure that all other necessary consents in relation to the operation of a business in Late Hours Catering are in place prior to the operation of this licence.
