Minutes of Wednesday 02 November 2022 Community Centre at 7.00pm

2. Declaration of Interest: RT and FdF – Dailly Scouts

3. Carrick Wind Farm – Kirsten Rae, Gillian Arnot, Amy Pearson
KR gave a brief outline of what was happening re the Conjoined Inquiry which would include Carrick, Craiginmoddie and Knockcronal Wind Farms. Each wind farm will be discussed independently of each other and then relative to each other. The wind farms were all at the same basic stage of process. Scienteuch development is not at the same stage. ET raised various issues re the cumulative noise assessments and what data was used. ET would like more information and will discuss with CWF. Access route was pointed out as passing the Primary School on Main Street, which is not good. More info requested.

GA then gave an introduction to the Community Benefit - £5000 per MW possibly upto £430,000/year. Would be split between other communities involved. How the fund would be managed is to be discussed. Correct structure would be needed. A variety of projects can be funded, and can be used for Community Energy payments. An investment opportunity is also possible on top of the CB. Various other questions relating to the investment side.

If consented the WF construction would not commence until 2025. ET advised that the community engagement was better than others.

4. Dailly Website – Iain Blackwood

Secretary advised that IB had agreed to update the existing website, and was in the process of gathering material. IB showed on the screen how the new site would look – more modern and easier to use, with ability to be used on mobile devices. Once more information has been uploaded, he might be able to put it out live with additional updates on-going. Still a work in progress but hope to be up by December. Everyone thought that it was definitely an improvement on the old one – things have moved on since that one was up and running.

5. Minutes of Previous Meeting

Minutes of 05 October 2022 were proposed by RT seconded by PW.

He indicated that the most important thing was to report any ASB issues either to the Police through 101 or to the SAC relevant department. If nothing is being reported the various authority departments will not know that there are issues.

8. Matters Arising

G&SA Biosphere

On-going - Biosphere Community, revisit later next year – leave on agenda.

LACER Funding Application

Secretary advised that funding of £6,000 should be in the account by 03 Nov. PW together with Pauline Eaglesham (Comm Hall Association) have organised 9 volunteers to help with the functioning of the Pantry. Shop fittings had been located from a closing shop and will be donated, therefore no upfront costs. Both Dailly shops were very happy to work with the Pantry and Voucher Scheme. PW will speak separately with Secretary and Treasurer about working with the funding. Opening hours had been worked out with SAC and the caretaker Maybeth to facilitate delivery of items and the actual opening of the Pantry. Thanks to RT the Church Hall can also be used as a storage area. The Drop-in/Cosy Room would be available, tea and coffee, second-hand clothes/uniforms/books and small goods all part of the whole scheme. It was acknowledged that a lot of hard work and effort had been put into getting this set-up. The intention is to have an opening ceremony on Friday 18 Nov at 4pm.

Energy Agency

Secretary had not had time to contact the EA – JF indicated that she has a contact and would get in touch. Suggested time as before.

9. Wind Farms – General

Per headings below (have taken away ones that have not been updated recently):

Clauchrie to Knockodhar overhead lines – SPR - waiting ECU advice.

Clauchrie – Consents Unit - ECU00002001 (ref 074). SAC formally objected. Public Enquiry – DPEA – WIN-370-3 – is now with the Reporter – a lot of controversy.

Important – DPEA advised that Craiginmoddie, Carrick and Knockcronal are under a Conjoined Inquiry. Secretary will attend the Pre-Examination Meeting o/b/o the CC with the inquiry taking place in May 2023. The reporters to submit their reports to Scottish Ministers in October 2023 for a decision.

Craiginmoddie – reduced to 14T up to max 200m – basically ex-Hadyard Hill Extension – Energie Kontor. Full consultation ECU00002196 – response submitted to ECU. Additional Information consultation response submitted 13 Jan 2022. SAC had objected at their Regulatory meeting on 03 Feb. *Now under Appeal with DPEA – WIN-370-4 – DCC have indicated that we will be involved with the oral process. Other members of the community have also received documentation and will also participate. Some have not received the oral process info – DPEA/ECU checking.*

Carrick Forest – reduced to 13T up to 200m inc Energy Storage System – ECU00002063 – scoping response sent. *Full consult, ECU00003392 – response submitted on 28 May 2022. SPR attended as above. DPEA – WIN-370-5.*

Knockcronal – Scoping – ECU00002181 – response lodged - ex-Linfairn, now 9T up to 200m, and 3T up to 180m. Public Events at Dailly and Straiton. Stratkraft/ECU – extension until 14 Feb. Objection submitted 13 Feb. **DPEA – WIN-370-6.**

Kirk Hill – planning extension granted to 2022 – height now 115.5m. Ripple Energy attended July meeting. *Ripple advise work progressing re site entrances/compound, forestry work, check HGV traffic increase. ET advising some roads already a mess. Ripple still not contacted DCC or other CCs re Benefit Funds – Secretary to check Ripple/others.*

Tralorg – operational since 21 Oct 2020. Funds received. *Nothing new/additional.*

Knockodhar – 32T tip height up to 200m inc Energy Storage System. South side of Stinchar Valley. In Scoping ECU00002153 – sent response 27 Nov 2020. *REG send postcard out to community re Public Exhibitions – Barrhill, Barr, P&P – not all members had received.*

Scienteuch – *in SAC Planning 22/00654/DEEM – RES Natural Power* – ECU00003318 – 9T, up to 200m – basically Lamdoughty and Keirs Hill, NE of Straiton, S of Patna.

Chirmorie was again being consulted – SAC 22/00660/FURM – pending consideration – 22T upto 146.5m height.

If members of the community have any comments regarding proposed windfarms, they should make their views, whether positive or negative, known to the CC as soon as possible, or direct them straight to the planning application.

10. Paths / Dailly Trails / Dalquharran

Nothing major happening re paths – there had been a lot of rain, so paths a bit messy.

Secretary had been in touch with Ian Findlay Path Fund – they indicated other possible funders, but nothing concrete to use - possibly ARIA in the Spring.

11. Roads / Potholes / Gully Pots

Secretary to contact ARA re update on a couple of outstanding issues - hedges on the U25 and sunken drain grids at the Square. School, LM and Secretary advised ARA of gully pot/flooding issue in front of the School and Main Street.

12. Hadyard Hill Community Fund Dailly - Panel and Small Grant Fund

Clare Graham/FS had sent out posters for the Education and Training Fund and these had been put up around the village, and on the FB/Website. There had been several enquiries already.

Small Grant Fund – one application from the Scouts for 4 storage units/lock-ups for a total of £118. FdF and RT left the room. All thought this was a good use of funds, help to keep their equipment in order – unanimously approved.

Christmas Light info now under Community Hall Association.

13. Development Trust/SCIO

PW together with the Secretary would be meeting with Tom Henderson/SAC re assistance generally re the SCIO, and getting documentation re ownership of various assets within the Village.

14. Community Hall Association

NB was unable to attend, and there was nothing substantial to report – they were still looking for a Secretary, however PW advised that he is taking this role for one year only.

The Comm Hall old library room would be used for the Pantry, and shelving/storage would be installed over the next two weeks, with opening on 18 Nov, all being well.

There had been issues re additional keyholder access outside of the caretaker's hours. This has been worked on and there was now a certain amount of coverage.

A grant of £1,500 had been applied for the Drop-in room through VASA. Still awaiting some items for the room.

PW was now a signatory on the Christmas Lights account and advised that there was about £150 in the account. Lightways would be charging approx. £4,500 for putting up the lights including lighting the Christmas Tree at £2,368. It was agreed that the Community would handle the lights for the Tree, therefore the agreed funding of £3,000 would cover the actual Village lights.

15. Carrick Activity Centre

HM advised that the AGM was held on Tuesday 25 Oct – one trustee retired and a new member/trustee came on board – Paul Pain.

16. Councillor's Report

Cllr PH was not able to attend.

17. Treasurer's Report

FdF advised following balances - DCD a/c: £1,173, DCC a/c: £39,539 - no change.

18. Any Other Business

Remembrance Sunday – 13 November at 10.50am.

Notice Board – PW advised that another board might be useful, as the existing one by Morrisons was quite crowded with information. Secretary had previously looked at putting one on the wall at the Post Office/Store facing the Square – to be re-checked.

Waste Management – CC advised that he had organised a new large bin for the School area.

Doughty Hill Forestry Plan – Secretary had received a consultation document, and had passed to JF and ET for any comment – deadline 07 Nov.
