National Context

Equally Safe Strategy: Scotland's strategy for preventing and eradicating violence against women and girls

Developed by the Scottish Government and CoSLA, Scotland's strategy for preventing and eradicating violence against women and girls.

Equally Safe, was published in 2014 with the vision of 'a strong and flourishing Scotland where all individuals are equally safe and respected, and where women and girls live free from all forms of violence and abuse – and the attitudes that help perpetuate it'.



Updated Equally Safe Strategy Summer 2022- Autumn 2023: Equally Safe update

Violence against women and girls encompasses (but is not limited to):

- physical, sexual and psychological violence occurring in the family (including children and young people), within the general community or in institutions, including domestic abuse, rape, and incest;
- sexual harassment, bullying and intimidation in any public or private space, including work;
- commercial sexual exploitation, including prostitution, lap dancing, stripping, pornography and trafficking;
- child sexual abuse, including familial sexual abuse, child sexual exploitation and online abuse;
 and
- so called 'honour based' violence, including dowry related violence, female genital mutilation, forced and child marriages, and 'honour' crimes

Equally Safe is shaped around the following key priorities:

- Scottish society embraces equality and mutual respect, and rejects all forms of violence against women and girls
- Women and girls thrive as equal citizens: socially, culturally, economically and politically
- Interventions are early and effective, preventing violence and maximising the safety and wellbeing of women, children and young people
- Men desist from all forms of violence against women and girls, and perpetrators of such violence receive a robust and effective response

SAVAWP fully supports the Equally Safe strategy and will continue to align its strategic action plan to the four key priority areas as detailed above.

In addition to the national strategy, consideration continues to be given to Equally Safe Quality Standards and Performance Framework.

About South Ayrshire

By 2043, the South Ayrshire population is projected to be 105,191 – a decrease of 6.5% compared to the population in 2018. The population of Scotland as a whole is projected to increase by 2.5%.

The projected change in South Ayrshire is not evenly spread across the different age groups. The number of children aged 0-15 years is projected to decrease by 17% and our working age population by 14%.

The pensionable age population is, however, projected to increase by 17% by 2043. More dramatically, the South Ayrshire population aged 75+ is projected to increase by 65% by 2043.

These anticipated changes to the population will have considerable consequences for the Council as it strives to ensure social, educational, housing and community services continue to meet the needs of the community.










POPULATION






Our Partnership

As previously mentioned, the SAVAWP fully supports the Equally Safe strategy and is committed to addressing violence against women including gender-based violence and domestic abuse.

SAVAWP contributes to the overarching CPP outcome of 'safer communities', the Community Safety Partnership vision of 'people in South Ayrshire live in communities that are inclusive, empowered, resilient and safe' and the priority area of 'reducing the level of violence and antisocial behaviour in our communities'.



Joint Action Groups

There are 2 Joint Action Groups that report to the SAVAWP:

VAWP Joint Action Group

The remit of the VAWP Joint Action Group is to implement project areas identified through the strategic action plan.

This will include the planning and delivery of activities and events for the annual 16-days of action campaign

Sexual Exploitation Joint Action Group (Sexual Exploitation Forum)


The Sexual Exploitation Joint Action Group is a sub-group of the South Ayrshire Violence Against Women Partnership to improve the response to sexual exploitation.

In 2020, <u>a Sexual Exploitation Strategy (2020-25)</u> was approved by South Ayrshire Health and Social Care Partnership (SAHSCP) and this is led by the Sexual Exploitation Joint Action Group.

The Sexual Exploitation Joint Action Group provides update reports to each Child Protection Committee (CPC) and Adult Protection Committee (APC) which takes place on a quarterly basis. The APC and CPC report directly to South Ayrshire Chief Officers' Group for Public Protection (COG). The COG comprises Chief Officers who are members of the CPP.

Both groups are made up of partners from: Education, Social Work, Community Learning and Development, Housing, Community Safety, Police Scotland, NHS Ayrshire and Arran, Moving On Ayrshire and South Ayrshire Women's Aid.


There will also be areas of action developed in collaboration with other strategic groups within South Ayrshire including South Ayrshire Child Protection Committee. This will be carried out through VAWP representation on the CPC Public Information and Engagement Group and the South Ayrshire Inter-agency Child Protection Learning and Development Group.



Trauma informed

The Sottish Government has committed to preventing and reducing the negative impact of childhood adversity and trauma. Links have been identified both nationally and internationally between higher experience of adverse childhood experiences and community safety issues such as offending, violence, substance misuse and domestic abuse.

SAVAWP aims to create physically and emotionally safe environments that are both Trauma informed and responsive.
