SUBJECT: ANNUAL INSPECTION AND SAFETY CERTIFICATES FOR THE REGULATED STANDS AT AYR RACECOURSE

1. Purpose

1.1 To advise the Panel of the outcome of the annual technical inspections at Ayr Racecourse, and to seek approval for the issue of revised Safety Certificates for the two stands.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 It is recommended that the Panel:
 - 2.1.1 agrees that the current Safety Certificates remain in force until 30th June 2023, provided that no adverse reports are received at the meeting; and
 - 2.1.2 agrees that the revised Safety Certificates will come into force on 1st July 2023, for the period of one year.

3. Background

- 3.1 Ayr Racecourse is covered by the provisions of the Fire Safety and Safety of Places of Sports Act 1987. Part III of the Act applies to sports grounds which provide covered accommodation in stands for spectators but are not designated sports grounds in terms of the Safety of Sports Grounds Act 1975. Safety Certificates require to be issued for grandstands ("regulated stands"), which provide covered accommodation for 500 or more spectators.
- 3.2 Main guidance is given in the "Guide to Safety of Sports Grounds", the ("Green Guide"). Although the guide has no statutory force, its recommendations can be made statutory by their inclusion in Safety Certificates.

- 3.3 Ayr Racecourse currently has two grandstands which are classed as regulated stands, the Princess Royal (also known as the Club Stand) and the Eglinton Stand.
- 3.4 It should be noted that the Safety Certificates cover only the grandstands, their associated entrances and exits and the concourses in front of the stands. The Racecourse is not classified as a designated Sports Ground under the 1975 Act. The certificates do not cover the Eglinton Rooms, Rothesay Stand, Paddock area etc.
- 3.5 The current Certificate remains in force until 30th June 2023, unless withdrawn by the Council.
- 3.6 The Safety Certificates states that all assessments, surveys and reports required, should be completed by 28th February each year, with any remedial works carried out to the satisfaction of the Council by 31st May. It should be noted that inspections are carried out prior to the Scottish National meeting, normally held in mid-April and the Gold Cup held in September each year. Both of which attracts the largest attendances.

4. Proposals

Technical Reports

4.1 Building Standards Services, South Ayrshire Council

- 4.1.1 A visit was made to the Racecourse on 12th May 2023. It can be reported that all the required assessments, surveys, certification and reports are now in place, with the exception of, the Structural Certificate, which is signed off after the 2023 Maintenance Programme has been completed. The 2023 Maintenance Programme contains a number of minor items to be repaired, and these will be completed by the 30th June 2023.
- 4.1.2 The structural report submitted as part of the required assessments, identified some significant deterioration in the condition of the Eglinton Stand. Remedial works were carried out on the structure during the year, and some further works were carried out prior to the Scottish Grand National meeting in April. The works carried out allowed the majority of stand to be used during the event with some areas restricted. The report also highlighted further works that may be required to the structure to secure its long-term future.

We are currently working with the racecourse management team and safety officers to determine how this work will be programmed. This may require a temporary closure of the stand during the year; however it should be noted that for the majority of the race meetings the Eglington Stand is not in use.

- 4.1.3 The Scottish Grand National meeting was held this year on 22nd April 2023 and attracted an attendance of 17.171, and the Ayr Gold Cup meeting was held on the 17th September 2022 with an attendance of 10,821. No adverse reports specifically in relation to the grandstands were received about either meeting.
- 4.1.4 At the debrief for the Scottish Grand National meeting in April 2022, stakeholders raised some issues, including problems in relation to the exiting of the Racecourse following the event. Several meetings were subsequently held with various agencies and mitigation measures were put in place prior to the Gold Cup meeting in September 2022.

These included an expanded traffic management plan, and the limiting of pick up after the event from the front of the Racecourse. It can be confirmed that the measures implemented resulted in reduced number of issues raised at the Gold Cup in September.

We are continuing to work with Racecourse and stakeholders to improve on these arrangements, both for the local residents, and the event patrons.

1. Purpose

1.1 To advise the Panel of the outcome of the annual technical inspection of Somerset Park, Ayr, and to seek approval for the issue of revised Safety Certificates for the ground.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 It is recommended that the Panel:
 - 2.1.1 agrees that the current Safety Certificate remains in force until 30th June 2023, provided that no adverse reports are received at the meeting; and
 - 2.1.2 agrees that the revised Safety Certificate will come into force on 1st July 2023, for the period of one year.

3. Background

- 3.1 Under the Safety of Sports Ground Act 1975 Somerset Park is designated as a ground requiring a General Safety Certificate. In addition to the Safety of Sports Grounds Act 1975 the ground is covered by the Fire Safety and Safety of Places of Sport Act 1987, and related Safety of Sports Grounds Regulations. Main guidance is given by the "Guide to Safety at Sports Grounds", (the "Green Guide"). Although the guide has no statutory force, many of its recommendations are made statutory by their inclusion in the General Safety Certificate.
- 3.2 Somerset Park currently has a General Safety Certificate issued by South Ayrshire Council to Ayr United Football Club (AUFC). Under the terms of the Certificate AUFC are defined as "Holders" of the Certificate. The Certificate sets the ground capacity of Somerset Park at 10,185.

3.3 The current Certificate is valid until 30th June 2023, unless withdrawn by the Council. The Safety Certificate states that all assessment, surveys and reports required should be completed by 28th February each year, with any remedial works carried out to the satisfaction of the Council by **14th July**, prior to the beginning of the new football season.

4. Proposals

Technical Reports

4.1 Building Standards Services, South Ayrshire Council

- 4.1.1 A annual site inspection was made to Somerset Park on 12th May 2023. It can be reported that all the required assessments, surveys, certification and reports are now in place. The annual Structural Assessment Report has been received by the Council along with required Structural Safety Certificate. Within the Report there is a number of maintenance works required and as such a schedule of works has been prepared and issued to AUFC for completion prior to 14th July 2023. A further inspection will be scheduled by Building Standards to confirm that all necessary works are completed by the 14th July 2023.
- 4.1.2 As part of general upgrading of the overall stadium two replacement external stairs to the main stand were installed in October 2017. The installation of these new stairs required the benefit of a Building Warrant which was not sought at that time of the installation. The new stairs erected did not comply with required current Building Regulations and AUFC were informed that they would require to apply for a Late Building Warrant. I can now advice the panel that the acceptance of a completion certificate for the two stairs was issued on 2nd August 2022, and that these are now in full use during matches
- 4.1.3 Ayr Utd are currently in the process of carrying out major ground redevelopment works by the replacement of the Ally Macleod building in the north stand area of the ground. The proposal is for an all-seated stand with new hospitality areas to the rear. This work will also include the replacement of the existing turnstiles at the north end of Somerset Road and some additional car parking.

Planning permission has been approved and the required Building Warrants have been submitted. I can confirm that the demolition warrant for the Ally MacLeod suite has been issued and the works have commenced on site. The proposed completion date for the new stand is prior to the commencement of the 2024/25 football season.

The major development works of the new stand will require the closure of the North terracing area and associated turnstiles. This will therefore require a reduction in the existing ground capacity for a period to allow the works to carried out safely. We are currently working with the Club and the safety officer in relation to the final ground capacity during the works, and I can confirm that this will be in place prior to the issuing of the safety certificate on the 1st July 2023.

It is currently envisaged that the ground capacity set on the 1st July 2023 will be in place for the full 2023/24 season. However, depending on the construction programme of the new stand, and the possibility of scheduled high-profile games (Scottish Cup), it might be necessary to increase the approved capacity during the season. As such, we would therefore bring a further report back to panel for approval of an amended safety certificate for any increased capacity required.

4.1.4 The newly constructed stand will a capacity of over 500 seats along with some of the existing north area terracing, which will still be utilised in front of the stand. Once the development works are complete including the new stand, and after the acceptance of the Building Warrant completion certificate, a new safety certificate will be required to be issued which will set the final new ground capacity going forward.
